A book entitled "The Hut Six Story", by Gordon Welchman, has been published in the United States and is due for publication in this country in June.

2. Welchman was in charge of Hut 6 at Bletchley Park during the first part of the War. Hut 6 was responsible for the cryptanalysis of German Enigma traffic. The book goes into very considerable technical detail about the methods developed for this work. Much of the information in the book is still classified in both the United Kingdom and the United States.

3. Little World War II cryptanalytic information is directly relevant to present day exploitation. None of the revelations are directly damaging to UKUSA Sigint. There must however be some indirect damage, in the sense that so long as Sigint and cryptanalysis are kept in the public eye by books of this sort, foreign COMSEC organisations will receive more funds and will be stimulated to greater efforts.

4. The United States Justice Department have concluded that for all practical purposes legal action against Welchman in the United States is not feasible. In this country, it is thought that any legal action to try to prevent publication would be difficult, with no guarantee of success. The Secretary of the D Notice Committee has spoken to the British publishers, but after consideration they have decided to go ahead.

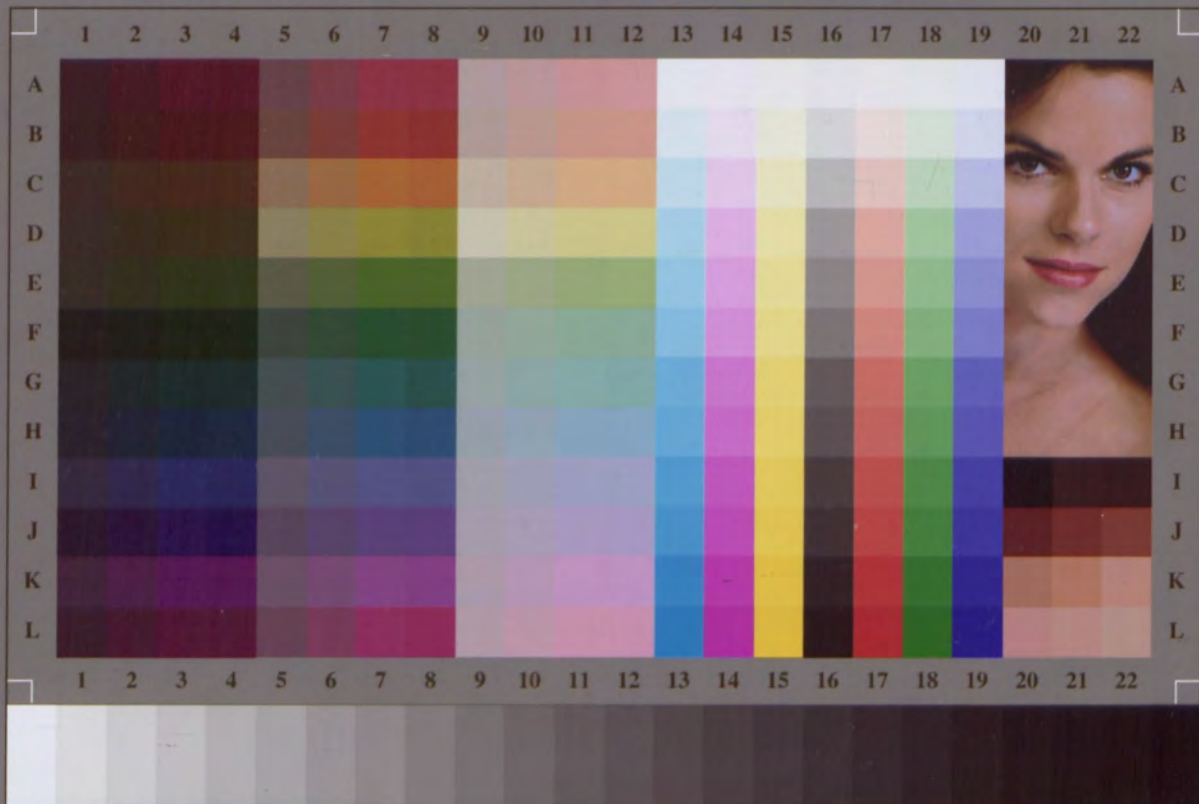
