PRIME MINISTER'S VISIT TO LILLE, 20 JANUARY 1986 : CHANNEL FIXED

SUMMARY

1. A VERY WARM RECEPTION FOR THE PRIME MINISTER IN LILLE FOR THE CFL ANNOUNCEMENT. GREAT MEDIA INTEREST.

DETAIL

- 2. THE PRIME MINISTER VISITED LILLE ON 20 JANUARY TO AGREE WITH PRESIDENT MITTERRAND THE CHOICE OF PROMOTER TO CONSTRUCT THE CHANNEL FIXED LINK, AND TO ANNOUNCE THE DECISION TO THE WORLD'SD PRESS. THE CITY PUT ON A FINE SHOW. ITS ROADS CLEARED OF TRAFFIC AND IN BRIGHT WINTER SUNSHINE, LILLE DISPLAYED ITS MUNICIPAL BUILDINGS TO MAXIMUM EFFECT.
- 3. APART FROM MAUROY, MAYOR OF LILLE, MITTERRAND WAS FLANKED BY AN ARRAY OF NATIONAL AND LOCAL POLITICIANS, MANY OF WHOM HAVE THEIR POLITICAL BASES IN NORTHERN FRANCE. PRIME MINISTER FABIUS, A LONG-STANDING ENTHUSIAST FOR THE CFL SINCE HIS DAYS AS INDUSTRY MINISTER, ATTENDED THE TALKS BETWEEN PRIME MINISTER AND PRESIDENT AND WAS AT MITTERRAND'S SIDE WHEN THE CHOICE OF PROJECT WAS ANNOUNCED. IN ADDITION MITTERRAND WAS ACCOMPANIED BY DUMAS, AUROUX (TRANSPORT, TOWN PLANNING AND HOUSING), JOSSELIN (TRANSPORT), LENGAGNE (MARITIME AFFAIRS AND ALSO MAYOR OF BOULOGNE), DELEBARRE (EMPLOYMENT) AND LE GARREC (PUBLIC SERVICES).
- 4. THE VISIT BEGAN WITH AN HOUR-LONG MEETING BETWEEN THE PRIME MINISTER AND MITTERRAND AND PARALLEL MEETINGS BETWEN YOU AND DUMAS, MR RIDLEY AND AUROUX. HEADS OF GOVERNMENT IN THEIR MEETING CONFIRMED THE CHOICE OF THE CTG/FRANCEMANCHE PROJECT FOR THE CHANNEL FIXED LINK AND PUT FINAL TOUCHES TO THE JOINT COMMUNIQUE. THE ATMOSPHERE OF THE DISCUSSIONS WAS RELAXED AND WARM THROUGHOUT.
- 5. THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE SUCCESSFUL CFL PROJECT WAS MADE BY THE PRIME MINISTER AND THE PRESIDENT IN LILLE'S SPLENDID HOTEL DE VILLE, FILLED TO CAPACITY WITH SCHOOL CHILDREN, WHO LINED THE ENTRANCE HALL

WAVING.

WAVING UNION FLAGS. OTHER CITIZENS OF LILLE AND SURROUNDING AREAS. AND THE MASSED RANKS OF THE MEDIA. THE PRESIDENTS BRIEF DECLARATION IN FRENCH OF THE WINNING PROJECT, LOST NONE OF ITS SIGNIFICANCE AND DRAMA EVEN THOUGH IT CONFIRMED THAT THE PROJECT MOST WIDELY TIPPED BY THE PRESS HAD INDEED WON. IN A BRIEF INTRODUCTORY SPEECH, THE PRESIDENT EMPHASIZED THE HISTORIC NATURE OF THE DECISION FOR RELATIONS BETWEEN FRANCE AND THE UK, AND MORE WIDELY ITS SIGNIFICANCE IN TERMS OF THE CONSTRUCTION OF EUROPE. THE PRIME MINISTER UNDERLINED HER VIEW OF THE SPECIAL NATURE OF THE OCCASION, EMPHASISING ALSO THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE CFL FOR TRADE AND COMMUNICATIONS BETWEEN THE UK AND FRANCE AND THE OPPORTUNITY BEING OFFERED TO THE PRIVATE SECTORS IN BOTH COUNTRIES TO UNDERTAKE A PROJECT OF NATIONAL IMPORTANCE. THE FACT THAT THE PRIME MINISTER CONCLUDED HER SPEECH WITH A PASSAGE IN FRENCH WAS WARMLY APPRECIATED AND IT WAS THIS PART OF THE PROCEEDINGS WHICH WAS PROMINENTLY FEATURED ON NATIONAL TELEVISION IN THE EVENING.

6. CONCLUDING THE CEREMONY AT THE TOWN HALL, MAUROY GAVE A SHORT BUT EXPANSIVE SPEECH ABOUT THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE DAY TO THE TOWN, THE REGION, THE TWO COUNTRIES AND TO EUROPE. EVENTS CONCLUDED WITH THE PRESENTATION TO THE PRIME MINISTER OF THE LILLE GOLD MEDAL AND THE UNVEILING BY THE TWO HEADS OF GOVERNMENT OF A PLAQUE.

7. AT A LUNCH IN THE PREFECTURE HOSTED FOR THE PRIME MINISTER AND HER PARTY BY THE PRESIDENT, NO FORMAL SPEECHES WERE GIVEN, BUT THE PRIME MINISTER ACKNOWLEDGED THE PRESIDENT'S TOAST BY SAYING HOW MUCH SHE LOOKED FORWARD TO WELCOMING HIM TO THE UK FOR THE CFL TREATY SIGNING CEREMONY ON 12 FEBRUARY.

8. TEXTS OF SPEECHES (WHERE ISSUED) WILL FOLLOW BY BAG. MIFT GIVES AN ACCOUNT OF FRENCH PRESS COVERAGE OF THE CFL DECISION.

ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE VISIT OF THE PRIME MINISTER AND SECRETARY OF STATE FOR FOREIGN AND MONDAY 20 JANUARY 1986

DATE AND PLACE OF MEETING

The Prime Minister, accompanied by the Secretary of State for Foreign and Commonwealth Affairs and Secretary of State for Transport together with those shown at Appendix I, will travel to Lille, France, on Monday 20 January for the Channel Fixed Link Summit Meeting.

PROGRAMME 2.

An outline programme is at Appendix II.

TRAVEL (all times local: London = GMT; Lille = GMT + 1)

Outward: Monday 20 January

The Prime Minister and party will travel in an RAF VC10, Task No Ascot 1129, departing London Heathrow (Southside) at 0835 hours, arriving Lille at 1030 hours local time. Flying time: 55 minutes. (Continental breakfast to be served.)

Return: Monday 20 January

The RAF VC10 will be on standby at Lille from 1430 hours. If the aircraft takes off at say 1445 hours, ETA LHR Southside would also be 1445 hours. Flying time: 1 hour. (Afternoon tea to include snacks will be available.)

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS AND HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

- a) All passengers must be in possession of a valid passport. However, it is expected that the provision of passports will be waived on arrival in Lille.
- b) There are no special health requirements for France.

5. BAGGAGE AND INSURANCE

- a) Please see Appendix IV for baggage and insurance regulations on special flights.
- b) All official items and any items of personal hand baggage needed for the day trip will be cabin loaded. Labels are enclosed as follows:-

Please keep unused labels under safe cover.
In addition, press hand luggage will also bear a green label. (In separate distribution)

6. WORKING ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation will be made available at the British Consulate, Lille.

7. OFFICE EQUIPMENT AND STATIONERY

Electric typewriters, photocopier, common user stationery and office equipment will be available in the British Consulate.

8. COMMUNICATIONS

- i) The British Consulate switchboard will be manned throughout the visit.

9. SECURITY

a) Miss Hamilton will be documented as Special Courier for the No 10 party. Boxes and briefcases containing classified material must be entered on the respective way bill. Those concerned should contact Miss Rowan, Communications Operations Department, FCO (tel 233 3706).

CONFIDENTIAL b) Members of the FCO party carrying classified documents up to and including secret are asked to apply for a Letter of Authority from their Head of Department or Departmental Security Officer (see Home Circular B 3285 of 26 April 1985). If documents with a higher classification are carried, the official will have to be documented as a Special Courier (also contact Miss Rowan, COD (tel 233 3706). TRANSPORT 10. a) Transport in Lille will be supplied by the French Government and the British Embassy. Transport in the UK: i) No 10 Downing Street will be responsible for arranging transport to and from London Heathrow (Southside) for the Prime Minister and No 10 party. Members of the Department of Transport will also make their own transport arrangements. Conference and Visits Section will arrange ii) transport for members of the FCO party to and from London Heathrow (Southside). iii) The VC10 is due to take off at 0835 hours. Members of the party should arrive at the times stated in schedule of Departure Arrangements which will be issued separately. 11. PRESS A press party will travel on the RAF VC10. Transport to and from Lille Airport and in Lille will be provided by the French Government. 12. FINANCE

- a) Costs for the No 10 party and the Conference Officer will be charged to the Management and Personnel Office. The costs for Mr Lederer and the booth interpreter plus common service costs will also be charged to the Management and Personnel Office.

APPENDIX IV

TRAVEL ON SPECIAL FLIGHTS

BAGGAGE AND INSURANCE REGULATIONS

1. BAGGAGE

(a) Those travelling by RAF aircraft are reminded that baggage should be left unlocked for the customary check. Butane gas lighter refills and matches, other than safety ones, may not be taken on the aircraft; certain aerosol sprays are now accepted on flights, provided they are not used on the aircraft. Any electrical items must be disconnected from their batteries.

2. INSURANCE

- (a) No refund of insurance premium is payable from public funds for officers on short-term visits overseas.
- (b) Those travelling by RAF aircraft are subject to the same statutory limits of compensation as apply to carriage by commercial airlines but international journeys to or from the UK with an agreed stopping place in the United States are governed by the provisions of the IATA/Montreal Agreement which include a compensation limit higher than the statutory one. Prospective travellers in RAF aircraft are advised to check whether their personal insurance policies provide cover for travelling by non-commercial flights and to consult their insurers if they are in any doubt about their position.
- (c) When the personal property (other than money or luxury articles) of an officer sent overseas on a short-term visit is lost or damaged during transit to or from the UK or while he is in receipt of subsistence allowance (but not local allowances and DSA) during his stay overseas and the loss or damage is not covered by an existing insurance policy, and the officer himself has not been negligent, compensation may be paid at the discretion of PSD. The amount of compensation would be based on the current cost of replacing the articles less an amount for depreciation or, if less, the full cost of repair.



I attach a copy of the full draft programme as it now stands. I wrote to you on 15 January about some changes in French plans for speeches at the Summit. You will wish to know how matters now stand and what drafts and briefing are in preparation. The programme provides for the Prime Minister to have a 45 minute tete-a-tete with President Mitterrand; to give a 5 minute statement at the announcement ceremony; to field questions at the press conference; and to make some brief remarks in response to the President's short, informal speech after lunch. We are preparing briefing for the tete-a-tete and will let you have this shortly in the form of a scene setting letter. Department of Transport officials are negotiating a joint statement with the French to be issued at the press conference. The Department of Transport, in consultation with the FCO and other interested Departments, are also preparing drafts for the opening statement and the after lunch speech and briefing notes for the press conference. These may have to be finalised at a late stage. I am copying this letter to Richard Allan in the Department of Transport. CHANNEL FIXED LINK SUMMIT MEETING, LILLE, 20 JANUARY : PROGRAMME

I 10.30 : Arrival at Lille Airport

Notes :

- (a) The President will arrive at the airport at about 10.20 and will meet the Prime Minister at the foot of the aircraft steps.
- (b) There will then be a military guard of honour and national anthems.
- (c) The President and Prime Minister will leave together in the President's car, accompanied by the President's interpreter and a security official.
- (d) The rest of the official motorcade will follow on. A bus and minibus will be provided for transporting journalists.

II 10.45 - 11.30 : Meeting

Notes :

- (a) The motorcade will arrive at Lille Prefecture at 10.45.
- (b) Four meeting rooms have been provided: one for the Prime Minister and President; one for Sir G. Howe and M. Dumas; one for Mr Ridley and M. Auroux; and one for officials.
- (c) At the tete-a-tete with the Prime Minister. President Mitterrand will be accompanied by his interpreter and probably by M. Attali. Mr Lederer will interpret for the Prime Minister, who may wish also to have a Private Secretary in attendance.
- (d) No interpreter is required for Sir G. Howe and M. Dumas; the French will provide one for Mr Ridley and M. Auroux.

- (a) The President and Prime Minister will travel by car from the Prefecture to the Hotel de Ville, where they will be met by M. Mauroy, Mayor of Lille (and former Prime Minister).
- (b) Seating arrangements will comprise a "top table" for the President, Prime Minister, Foreign Ministers and Transport Ministers, and a main area for press and officials.
- (c) The French envisage an announcement by an official of the two governments' decision on the CFL concessionaire; followed by a 5 minute statement by President Mitterrand; followed by a 5 minute statement by the Prime Minister. Questions from the press would then be taken, for about 30 minutes.
- (d) Interpretation booths will be provided for both interpreters permitting simultaneous interpretation during the press conference.
- (e) At the conclusion of the press conference, M. Mauroy will make a short speech, present the President and Prime Minister with commemorative medals and invite them to sign a book. He may also present the Prime Minister with a gift (the FCO are in touch with No. 10 about whether the Prime Minister needs to reciprocate).
- (f) At 12.35 the press conference will end and M. Mauroy will lead the President and Prime Minister to the entrance hall of the Hotel de Ville, where a commemorative plaque will be unveiled.



Notes :

- (a) The party returns to the Prefecture by car for lunch.
- (b) Mr Ridley, plus Private Secretary and Press Secretary, will depart separately before the lunch for Lille Airport.
- (c) Lunch will not be more than 15 per side (the FCO has submitted separately on attendance).
- (d) The interpreters will be seated behind the President and Prime Minister.

(e) At the end of the lunch the President is likely to make a brief informal speech, to which the Prime Minister will wish to reply.
(f) There will probably be a separate table in the same room for officials not on the top table, and a further buffet lunch elsewhere in the building for support staff.



Foreign and Commonwealth Office London SW1A 2AH 15 January 1986 Dear Charles, Anglo/French Summit Meeting in Lille on 20 January The Embassy in Paris have now obtained further details from the Elysee of the arrangements for speeches etc at the Channel Fixed Link Summit meeting. The French propose that the President and Prime Minister speak briefly (for about 5 minutes each) at the opening of the press conference to announce the decision on the Link : this is in line with what I believe we have been assuming. In their original proposal the French mentioned that the press conference would be followed by lunch "with speeches". The Elysee have now said that President Mitterrand does not envisage these speeches being long and formal; he will probably "take something out of his pocket". The Prime Minister would therefore be expected to speak rather more briefly than we had previously been contemplating. The foregoing has already been passed on to the Department of Transport at working level, and officials are taking the new proposed arrangements into account in their preparations. 

CHANNEL FIXED LINK

Thank you for your letter of 6 January about the arrangements for the visit to Lille. I have also now spoken to Richard Allan.

The proposed programme seems fine. The only problem arises over timing. The Transport Secretary will need to make a statement in the House that afternoon, which will mean leaving Lille at 1330 local time. The options are:

- (a) to stick to the timings at present proposed, with the Transport Secretary peeling off early to return to London;
- (b) to bring the whole programme forward by 30/45 minutes.

I don't think the Prime Minister would mind which it was (though other things being equal she is keen to get back as soon as possible). Could our Embassy please discuss with the French whether they could agree without inconvenience to revise the timings to allow the whole party to leave at 1330.

It would also be helpful to have proposals for attendance at the Lille event. The Prime Minister would wish this to be kept small.



We have the following recommendations for travel and working accommodation for the Channel Fixed Link Summit meeting in Lille on 20 January.
