1. TRAVEL DETAILS

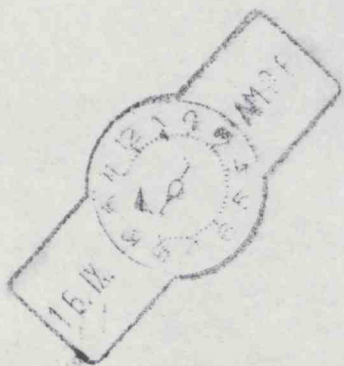

17 SEPTEMBER 1986

1. COMPOSITION OF THE PARTY

a) A full list of those in the Prime Minister's party is shown at Appendix I.

b) A Press Party will travel in the Prime Minister's aircraft. Names not available at time of going to print. Separate administrative arrangements are being issued to them.

2. PROGRAMME

An outline programme and itinerary for the visit are shown at Appendix II.

3. TRAVEL

a) The party will travel by RAF VC10 (Task No. Ascot 1144) from Cologne/Bonn to Fassberg where they will transfer to helicopters arranged by BFG. The party will return from Gutersloh to London Heathrow by RAF VC10.

b) The detailed itinerary for travel is shown at Appendix III.

4. PASSPORTS AND HEALTH

Each person travelling should have a valid passport. There are no special health requirements for Germany.

5. INSURANCE AND BAGGAGE

See administrative arrangements for the Anglo/German Summit.

1. DATE AND PLACE OF MEETING

The Prime Minister accompanied by the Foreign and Commonwealth Secretary, the Secretary of State for Defence, Minister of State for the Environment, and Minister of State for Industry and Information Technology, Department of Trade and Industry, together with those shown at Appendix I, will attend the Anglo-German Summit in Bonn on 16 September.

A party of press will travel on the Prime Minister's aircraft. Names not available at time of going to print. Separate administrative arrangements are being issued to them.

2. PROGRAMME

3. TRAVEL

(All times local: London = GMT + 1, Brussels = GMT + 2, Bonn = GMT + 2)

a) Outward on 16 September

i) The Prime Minister, Secretary of State for Defence, Minister for the Environment, Information Technology Minister and main party will travel on an RAF VC10, Task No. Ascot 1144, departing London Heathrow Southside at 1120 hours, arriving Cologne Bonn at 1330 hours local time. 17 September: The Foreign and Commonwealth Secretary and party will travel on the RAF HS125, Task No. Ascot 1539, on standby to depart from Cologne Bonn for Northolt at 1000 hours. Other members of the Delegation will return by commercial flights.

d) Full travel details are given in Appendix III.

4. **BAGGAGE AND INSURANCE REGULATIONS**

TRAVEL ON SPECIAL FLIGHTS

BAGGAGE AND INSURANCE REGULATIONS

1. BAGGAGE

- (a) Those travelling by RAF aircraft are reminded that baggage should be left unlocked for the customary check. Butane gas lighter refills and matches, other than safety ones, may not be taken on the aircraft; certain aerosol sprays are now accepted on flights, provided they are not used on the aircraft. Any electrical items must be disconnected from their batteries.
- (b) For space reasons those travelling in the HS 125 are asked to limit their personal baggage to one suitcase.
- (c) Those travelling in the VC10 may take up to 66lbs (30kgs) of personal baggage.

2. INSURANCE

- (a) No refund of insurance premium is payable from public funds for officers on short-term visits overseas.
- (b) Those travelling by RAF aircraft are subject to the same statutory limits of compensation as apply to carriage by commercial airlines but international journeys to or from the UK with an agreed stopping place in the United States are governed by the provisions of the IATA/Montreal Agreement which include a compensation limit higher than the statutory one. Prospective travellers in RAF aircraft are advised to check whether their personal insurance policies provide cover for travelling by non-commercial flights and to consult their insurers if they are in any doubt about their position.
- (c) When the personal property (other than money or luxury articles) of an officer sent overseas on a short-term visit is lost or damaged during transit to or from the UK or while he is in receipt of subsistence allowance (but not local allowances and DSA) during his stay overseas and the loss or damage is not covered by an existing insurance policy, and the officer himself has not been negligent, compensation may be paid at the discretion of PSD. The amount of compensation would be based on the current cost of replacing the articles less an amount for depreciation or, if less, the full cost of repair.

6. CHANCELLOR KOHL WILL HOST A DINNER IN THE PALAIS SCHAUMBURG FOR MINISTERS AND ONE OR TWO SENIOR OFFICIALS ONLY. THE BRITISH PARTICIPANTS WILL BE THE PRIME MINISTER, THE FOREIGN AND DEFENCE SECRETARIES, MR PATTIE, SIR JULIAN BULLARD, SIR CLIVE WHITMORE, MR POWELL AND MR INGHAM. GERMAN VISIT - PRESS ARRANGEMENTS

The first contact with the press will be on arrival at the Chancellery in Bonn at 1400 hrs on 16 September. It is not anticipated that press will cover the arrival at Koln Airport. You will be met by Chancellor Kohl at the heliport in the Chancellery and if weather permits walk with him to the guard of honour assembled outside his office. Press will be kept some distance from the helicopter but will be able to follow your progress up to and including the playing of the National Anthems etc. A restricted (pooled) photo facility will then be available to the press inside the Chancellery before your bilateral begins.

The joint press conference will be held in the Chancellery and 45 minutes has been allotted for this. There will be a very restricted photocall at the start of the plenary session (official photographers only) before your return to the Ambassador's Residence. You have agreed a thirty minute interview with Herr Bernt Conrad, the Diplomatic Correspondent of Die Welt. A separate note covers the interview.

Photographers will again be present for your arrival for the official dinner when you return to the Chancellery to the Palais Schaumburg. Inside the Palais photographers will record the receiving line and again they will be present for the toasts at the beginning of the meal.

The "military" programme on Wednesday, 17 September, requires an early 0810 departure from Bonn. The press have been organised by the Army Public Relations team and they expect anything up to 120 journalists to be following the

series of visits you are to make with the Chancellor throughout the day. You arrive at Fallingbostal at 1000 hours and preside over the General Salute. The Staffordshire regiment and an RAF band are to be inspected and the press will be at a fixed point throughout the formal ceremonial. After briefing on British Forces Germany in the Officers Mess, you begin a brief tour of the base.

Your first visit on the tour will be to the YWCA. You will be welcomed by the manager of the small shop and recreation facility, Mr Tucker, an ex-soldier whose wife is also involved in the running of the facility. The YWCA depends entirely on donations and self help to keep going. You and Chancellor Kohl will be invited to unveil a plaque commemorating the opening of a new "tenpin" bowling alley in the building's basement. Because of very limited space, only the Army's television crew and photographers will be present. After the unveiling, Mr Tucker will lead you on a brief walkabout through the restaurant and shop which will give you a chance to meet wives and families of the servicemen in the base. Press will be present outside the building to record your arrival and departure and it is anticipated that many families will be lining the pavements to greet you.

You are then to visit the Sergeants Mess and be offered coffee and invited to spend a few moments at each of six groups of members of the Mess before setting off for Hohne and the firing range. The press contingent will be there ahead of you assembled on vehicles which will enable them to follow you when you are invited to meet some of the tank crews participating. A changing room has been organised should you wish to go on board the tanks, but as a minimum precaution and particularly if it has been raining, robust shoes are strongly recommended.

Lunch is to be served in a marquee adjacent to the firing range followed by a second joint press conference in another marquee close by. The Army feel sure that questions will be asked, by the local press particularly, on the restriction of public access and environmental problems caused by the NATO forces' use of the area for training purposes. Details of your visit were leaked to local press on 6 September by a German politician.

Your next visit is to Sennelager to view a mock attack by four Harrier Aircraft and a mopping up operation by the RAF Regiment. The noise will be awful and you will be offered ear protection.

The press will be present throughout your visit, save for the ten minute briefing you will be given on what you are about to see. There is still some confusion as to the exact timing of Chancellor Kohl's departure from Sennelager but it is assumed you will wish to say goodbye to him before he helicopters back to Bonn.

Your last port of call is at RAF Gutersloh where you are to have discussions with the Commanders in Chief. Immediately after this meeting, fifteen minutes have been allocated for brief radio and television interviews on your visit by the British Forces Broadcasting Service. Details of these are given separately.

The Chief Press Officer will have a suite at the Steigenberger Hotel, where all others will be accommodated.

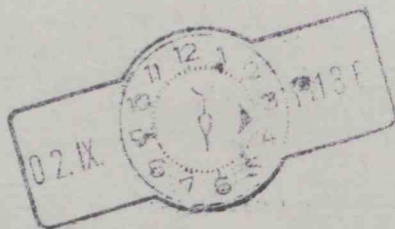

ANGLO/GERMAN SUMMIT, 16 SEPTEMBER: PARTICIPATION

As you know, arrangements are in hand for the Prime Minister, Defence Secretary and Foreign Secretary to attend the Anglo/German Summit in Bonn on 16 September. The Germans are now considering which, if any, other Ministers might be invited to participate. You and others may find it helpful to have a note setting out the present position.

On past form, Finance (Mr Lawson/Herr Stoltenberg) and Trade and Industry Ministers (Mr Channon/Herr Bangemann) would be invited. It is, however, already clear that it will not be possible for any of these Ministers to attend on 16 September. This is also true of Interior Ministers (Mr Hurd/Herr Zimmermann). It now seems likely that the Germans will propose participation by Environment Ministers. The newly appointed Environment Minister, Wallmann, is keen to establish himself in his new portfolio and has expressed a strong interest in participating in the Summit. Mr Ridley, however, has other commitments that day which he is reluctant to break. Although Mr Ridley has not yet been consulted, I understand that he would probably suggest that Mr Waldegrave, currently President of the Environment Council, should attend in his place if this was acceptable to the Prime Minister. We would expect the Germans to be content with this.

It is also possible that the Germans may make other suggestions, possibly Research (Herr Riesenhuber) or Junior Trade Ministers. Both Mr Pattie and Mr Clark have existing engagements overseas which would be difficult to rearrange.

There will be a meeting at Ministerial level between the CDU and the Conservative Party on 17 September in which Sir Geoffrey Howe and Mr Tebbit will take part. The German Ministerial participants are expected to be Finance Minister Stoltenberg, Research Minister Riesenhuber and Mrs Chalker's counterpart at the Auswärtiges Amt, Stavenhagen. Mr Tebbit is meeting, separately, Chancellor Kohl; the President of the Bundestag (Dr Jenninger); and the CDU Secretary General (Herr Geissler).

I shall write again when the Germans have given a clearer indication of their intentions. As Chancellor Kohl will be on holiday until 25 August we are unlikely to hear much before then.

I am copying this letter to the Private Secretaries of the Secretaries of State for Defence, Trade and Industry, the Environment, and of the Chancellor of the Exchequer, the Home Secretary and Sir Robert Armstrong.

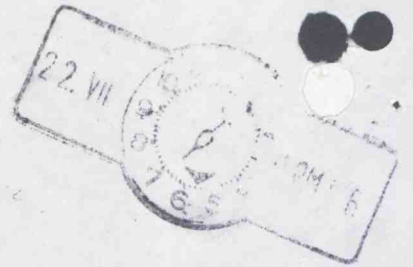

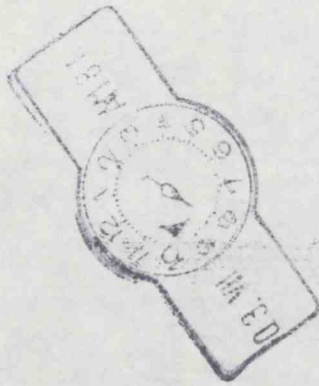

PRIME MINISTER'S VISIT TO BRITISH FORCES, GERMANY

Chancellor Kohl's office have now been in touch with me with a number of comments on the proposed programme for the visit by the Prime Minister and Chancellor Kohl to British Forces, Germany in September. They are as follows:

- (i) The time to be spent in Celle is too long both in itself and as a proportion of the programme as a whole. One candidate for shortening would be the briefing for which an hour has been allowed. Neither the Chancellor nor the Prime Minister are by nature patient with briefings.
- (ii) The Chancellor notes that it is proposed to take lunch in the Officers' Mess. He wonders whether it would not be possible to have lunch with both Officers and men? I am told that this would go down much better with public opinion in Germany (and perhaps here too).
- (iii) The Press Conference needs to be earlier in the programme if the visit is to attract the necessary attention in the German press (which goes to bed remarkably early). The Chancellor's office suggest that it should be held immediately after lunch.
- (iv) The Chancellor would like to see German troops involved in some part of the programme. He wants to emphasise the aspect of partnership. You will wish to consider to what extent it is possible to organise a joint demonstration. It was also suggested that a few German Officers and men might be present at the lunch.
- (v) The Chancellor has to be back in Bonn by 1800 hours at the latest. You will wish to ensure that the programme ends in time for him to do this.

These seem sensible points to me and I hope that you will take them into account in a revision of the programme which I shall want to put to the Prime Minister.
