

Foreign and Commonwealth Office London SW1A 2AH 25 April 1986 Prie Munto: Dear Charles, Journalist Anglo/Italian Summit: Prime Minister's Meeting with the Mayor of Florence You will recall that when the Prime Minister met the Mayor of Florence on 12 March, he asked her if a major British work of art could be lent for the city's 'European City of Culture' celebrations. She agreed to pass on this request; and in writing to Lord Bridges on 13 March she expressed the hope that we would be able to respond favourably. On investigation, this has proved problematic. Though aware of the Prime Minister's position, the British Council have already turned down a similar request, as they have serious doubts about the security and temperature of Italian galleries. Edinburgh City Council, which is twinned with Florence, has also refused, for the same reason. We have investigated other possible sources, but without any success: another major problem is that the British Council's policy decision means that there would be no Treasury indemnity, and expensive insurance would be necessary. And the case is further weakened by recent reports that the festival organisation is still chaotic. There is another new factor: the Mayor of Florence has recently been excluded from any participation in the organisation, which is now being handed over to a Commission of 'Twelve Wise Men'. That being so we propose, provided the Prime Minister has no objection, to send a message via our Ambassador in Rome that it has unfortunately proved impossible to provide a major painting of suitable quality at such short notice, and pointing out that the UK will in any event be represented by the exhibitions being organised by the British Council of English caricature and Ruskin deguerrotypes. I am copying this letter to Paul Thomas in Mr Luce's office. His colleagues have also considered this issue carefully, and agree with the views expressed above. On the way you will make a brief stop to see Botticelli's Primavera in the Uffizzi Gallery. When you get to the Palazzo Vecchio the Mayor of Florence will ask you to step briefly into his office to sign the Visitors Book and present you with a traditional gold florin.

- 2 -Incidentally, Signor Craxi will be presenting you with a hand-embroidered tablecloth. We are proposing that you should give him a piece of Crown Derby porcelain. My Secretary of State understands that a Confidential Memorandum of Understanding (CMU) about air services between the UK and Italy, on which agreement has recently been reached, is to be signed in the margins of the Summit meeting in Florence on Wednesday 12 March.

The CMU provides among other things for British Caledonian to commence services between Gatwick and Milan in competition with the Heathrow service operated by BA and Alitalia, and for Cathay Pacific to commence services between Hong Kong and Rome in competition with the services already operated by BA and Alitalia. Since the Cathay service is due to commence within the next few weeks it is important not to lose the opportunity to get the agreement signed.

The CMU would normally be signed at official level. But in view of its importance as another step towards increased competition in European air services, my Secretary of State suggests that Mr Spicer, Parliamentary Under Secretary of State in this Department with responsibility for aviation, might accompany the Prime Minister to Florence and sign the CMU himself. The British Embassy in Rome are exploring that possibility with the Italian Foreign Ministry and will report shortly. Subject to that advice my Secretary of State hopes the Prime Minister can agree that Mr Spicer should join her team for the Summit in order to sign the CMU.

REPRESENTATIVES OF THE CITY AUTHORITIES ARE LIKELY TO BE AT FLORENCE AIRPORT, INCLUDING THE CHIEF OF POLICE AND THE PREFECT. HM CONSUL (MR RAWLINSON) WILL ALSO BE PRESENT.

GREETING AT PALAZZO PITTI

3. CRAXI WILL MEET THE PRIME MINISTER IN THE MAIN COURTYARD OF THE PALAZZO (WHICH THE PRIME MINISTER'S CAR ONLY WILL ENTER). THE TWO PRIME MINISTERS WILL INSPECT A SMALL GUARD OF HONOUR. THE BRITISH NATIONAL ANTHEM (BUT NOT ITALIAN) WILL BE PLAYED. CRAXI WILL THEN ESCORT THE PRIME MINISTER INTO THE SALA DELLE AMBRE FOR THEIR TETE A TETE. PRESS AND PHOTOGRAPHERS WILL BE PRESENT IN THE COURTYARD: AND TV CAMERAS WILL BE PERMITTED BRIEFLY TO TAKE FILM OF THE OPENING MOMENTS OF THE PRIME MINISTER'S AND FOREIGN SECRETARY'S MEETINGS (BUT PROBABLY NOT OF THE OTHER MINISTERS). OTHER MINISTERS AND OFFICIALS WILL LEAVE THEIR CARS IN AN ADJACENT COURTYARD AND WALK THROUGH TO WATCH THE GREETING CEREMONY. ITALIAN PROTOCOL HOPES TO ARRANGE THAT THE ITALIAN MINISTERIAL TEAM WILL FE PRESENT IN THE COURTYARD TO MEET THEIR COLLEAGUES AND TO TAKE THEM TO THEIR RESPECTIVE MEETINGS.

MEETINGS

4. ALL MEETINGS TAKE PLACE IN THE SILVER MUSEUM OF PALAZZO PITTI. MINISTERS' MEETINGS WILL BE HELD IN A (COMPLICATED) SERIES OF INTER-CONNECTING ROOMS. A MEMBER OF THE EMBASSY STAFF WILL PE AVAILABLE TO TAKE THE RECORD AT THE PLENARY MEETING. ALTHOUGH PORTABLE RADIATORS WILL BE INSTALLED IN THE PALAZZO FOR THE OCCASION, MEETING ROOMS MAY BE A LITTLE COLD. THERE ARE ONLY LIMITED TOILET FACILITIES.

INTERPRETATION

5. SIMULTANEOUS INTERPRETATION THROUGH HEADPHONES WILL BE PROVIDED FOR THE PLENARY MEETING AND PRESS CONFERENCE. THE ITALIANS ARE PROVIDING INTERPRETERS FOR ALL INDIVIDUAL MINISTERIAL MEETINGS. IN ADDITION, HEAD OF CHANCERY, (RICHARDSON), WILL INTERPRET INTO ENGLISH FOR THE PRIME MINISTER AT HER TETE A TETE. EMBASSY OFFICIALS FAMILIAR WITH THE SUBJECT MATTER WILL BE ON HAND AT OTHER MINISTERIAL MEETINGS TO HELP IF NECESSARY WITH INTERPRETATION, AS FOLLOWS:-

OFFICIALS EXPECT CRAXI TO MEET THE PRIME MINISTER TO TAKE HER INTO LUNCH IN THE ANTE-CHAMBER TO THE PALATINE GALLERY: THE EXACT ARRANGEMENTS ARE STILL BEING CONSIDERED BUT THE ITALIANS EXPECT TO INVITE MINISTERS AND SENIOR OFFICIALS. AFTERNOON

8. THE PRIME MINISTER HAS AGREED TO VISIT THE SALA DEI CINQUECENTO IN THE PALAZZO VECCHIO (POWELL'S LETTER OF 22 JANUARY TO BUDD). TO ENABLE THIS TO BE DONE EASILY AND SECURELY THE ITALIANS ARE SPECIALLY OPENING FOR THE PM THE FAMOUS VASARI CORRIDOR, WHICH LINKS FALAZZO PITTI ABOVE STREET LEVEL WITH THE UFFIZZI GALLERY AND THE PALAZZO VECCHIO VIA THE PONTE VECCHIO. THE GALLERY HOUSES AN OUTSTANDING COLLECTION OF PORTRAITS NOT NORMALLY SEEN BY THE PUBLIC. WE SUGGEST THE PRIME MINISTER MAY WISH TO FAUSE BRIEFLY TO SEE BOTTICELLI'S PRIMAVERA IN THE UFFIZZI GALLERY. WE ASSUME THAT THE BRITISH PARTY WILL BE LIMITED TO MINISTERS, PRIVATE SECRETARIES, DETECTIVES AND SENIOR OFFICIALS ONLY. AN ENGLISH-SPEAKING GUIDE WILL BE PROVIDED FOR THE PRIME MINISTER. THE MAYOR OF FLORENCE, BOCIANCKING, WILL ESCORT THE PRIME MINISTER IN THE PALAZZO VECCHIO (TOWN HALL) TO THE SALA DET CINQUECENTO. HE HAS ASKED THAT THE PRIME MINISTER STEP BRIEFLY EN ROUTE IN HIS OFFICE WHERE HE WILL ASK HER TO SIGN THE VISITORS EOOK AND (PROBABLY) PRESENT HER WITH A TRADITIONAL GOLD FLORING WE HAVE ALLOWED FORTY MINUTES IN THE PROGRAMME FOR THIS VISIT. -3- RESTRICTED DEPARTURE



Anglo-Italian Summit: 12 March

Our Embassy in Rome have discussed arrangements with the Italian Prime Minister's office. Craxi's officials say he is content for the summit to be confined to one working day, 12 March. For internal political reasons, Craxi would like to stick to the original plan and hold it in Florence, probably at the Pitti Palace.

The following programme has been drawn up ad referendum:

0645	Take off from Northolt
0950	Prime Minister's party arrives at Pisa. Greeted by authorities.
1000	Leave for Florence by civilian helicopter, capacity 12-15. (Additional members of the Prime Minister's party travel by Military helicopter)
1025	Arrival in Florence.
1045	Prime Minister's tete-a-tete with Craxi (other Ministers hold concurrent bilateral talks).
1145	Heads of Government joined by Foreign Ministers.
1230	Plenary meeting.
1400	Lunch (either in Pitti Palace or at an hotel in Florence).
1530	Joint press conference (in Pitti Palace).
1615 (or 1645)	Leave for airport. (Depending on proposed visit visit to Sala de Cinquecento).
1710 (or 1740)	Leave Pisa for London.

The Italians agree (your letter to Len Appleyard of 19 December) that the Prime Minister be accompanied by the Secretaries of State for Foreign and Commonwealth Affairs, Defence, the Home Department and Trade and Industry. They may wish to field two Ministers to cover Trade and Industry. They showed no inclination to include Finance Ministers.

Craxi's office have commented that it would be a pity if the Prime Minister did not put aside a short time to see a little of Florence and suggested that she might visit the Sala del Cinquecento, which now serves as the seat of Florence Town Council. The visit would take half an hour. The Prime Minister could reach the building by walking along the famous private corridor of the Medicis (closed to the public) that runs between the Pitti Palace and the Uffizi Gallery over the Ponte Vecchio.

I should be grateful to know whether the Prime Minister is content with the proposed programme for the talks and arrangements for participation. Sir Geoffrey Howe thinks the Prime Minister would enjoy a brief visit to the Sala del Conquecento. The Italians would undoubtedly appreciate the Prime Minister's interest. Could you please also let me know her decision on this.

I am copying this letter to the Private Secretaries to the Secretaries of State for Defence, the Home Department, Trade and Industry and the Chancellor of the Exchequer and to Michael Stark.





Bilateral Summit with the Italian Government

As you will know, we earlier agreed with the Italian Government that a Bilateral Summit would be held on Wednesday, 30 October, probably in Florence. However, since this date was agreed matters have moved forward over Northern Ireland and it is now likely that if an agreement is reached, it will be concluded in the last week of October, and it will be very important for the Prime Minister to be in the country in the period immediately following that. For this reason, the Prime Minister wants to take steps now to postpone the Anglo-Italian Summit although of course it will not be possible to explain to the Italian Government, at any rate at this stage, the reasons for this. I should also say that it will unfortunately be impossible to find an alternative date for the Summit until early in 1986.

I should be grateful if you could consider how best to present this to the Italian Government. It may well be enough for HM Ambassador in Rome simply to explain to the Italian Government that the date of 30 October is no longer possible for the Prime Minister and that the Summit will have to be delayed until early in the New Year. But if you thought it essential, the Prime Minister would no doubt agree to send Signor Craxi a message presenting her excuses.
