FOREIGN SECRETARY'S CHRISTMAS RECESS TRAVEL 1988/89: ARABIA

Thank you for your letter of 3 June about the Foreign Secretary's intention to visit Saudi Arabia and a number of Gulf countries during the Christmas Recess. The Prime Minister is quite happy for the Foreign Secretary to undertake these visits. She has not yet considered her own visits programme for 1989. If she does decide to go abroad during the Christmas Recess, we shall have to look carefully at timings.

It is you wer king Fehr ill war to Christmas Recess Travel 1988: Arabia The Foreign Secretary is turning his mind to the question of how best to use the Christmas recess for overseas travel. He believes that Arabia should claim priority and would like to share his preliminary thoughts with the Prime Minister. While British commercial and military engagement in the Gulf region has increased markedly in the past three years, and while we have received high level visitors COP from some countries in Arabia, the number of visitors of Cabinet rank to those countries has been small. The Foreign Secretary would like to try to make good this neglect by arranging to visit during the Christmas recess three of the most important countries in the Arabian Peninsula (Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates, Kuwait) and two smaller countries (Yemen Arab Republic and Djibouti) which have long been ignored. Another important country (Oman) will have been visited briefly by the Prime Minister in August. Saudi Arabia is the self-evident first choice. The Foreign Secretary last went there in January 1986. Since then we have received King Fahd and are shortly to receive Crown Prince Abdullah. The Defence Secretary was the last Cabinet Minister to go there in February 1987, and the Foreign Secretary hopes that he wil be willing to go again this August to carry forward the defence relationship. Mr Parkinson has been invited to go in November; we hope he will. A visit by the Foreign Secretary at Christmas would maintain the momentum of top level outward visits. In the United Arab Emirates we have ground to make up. Shaikh Zaid is most helpful over facilities for Armilla/ Cimnel but is feeling increasingly exposed as US/Iranian military encounters become more frequent and spill over on to UAE interests. A personal demonstration of our regard for him in the form of a visit would reassure him and boost British interests. The last Cabinet Minister to visit the UAE was the then Foreign Secretary in 1983. The Foreign Secretary hopes Mr Younger may be able to visit the UAE this July as the first of a series of top-level visitors which might include Mr Parkinson in November and then the Foreign Secretary himself in the Christmas recess, to raise our bilateral profile in advance of TRH The Prince and Princess of Wales' visit to the UAE (and Kuwait) now planned for March 1989.



Although our relations with <u>Kuwait</u> have developed promisingly in the last twelve months thanks to the attention paid to senior Kuwaitis when they pass through London, and to our coincidence of interests over the recent hijacking, the Foreign Secretary was the last Cabinet Minister to visit Kuwait in January 1986. He hopes that Mr Younger will go there in July on defence business. Later in the year there is the risk that the outcome of the MMC investigation into the KIO holding in BP may lead to a setback in the relationship. Further high level attention may be needed to repair any damage. This would be an appropriate objective for a visit by the Foreign Secretary.

Finally, the Foreign Secretary hopes to include the Yemen Arab Republic which has never been visited by a Cabinet Minister but whose new oil find suddenly increases its importance; and Djibouti, which has given much assistance to the Royal Navy, on the way home.

A visit to these five countries would require the Foreign Secretary to be absent from the United Kingdom from the morning of Monday, 2 January to the evening of Tuesday, 10 January inclusive. His plans will of course depend on the Prime Minister's own visits programme. Apart from the likely stopover in Oman in the summer, she may wish to consider visiting for example Saudi Arabia, where she has not been since April 1985.

The Foreign Secretary is in touch with Mr Younger and Mr Parkinson about their possible visits to Arabia.

I am writing, as I have done in previous years, to say that the Prime Minister hopes that most of her Cabinet colleagues will be able to take their holidays in August so that the regular pattern of business in Cabinet and its main Committees can be resumed early in September. This is all the more necessary this year because the Prime Minister will be undertaking an official visit to the Far East from 16-29 September. If Cabinet Ministers find it necessary to be abroad in September, the Prime Minister would wish them to ensure that their deputies are available to help maintain the smooth conduct of Government business.

Looking beyond September, the first Cabinet meeting in October will be on the 14th of that month.

This seems to be the only possible date, as on the preceding Thursday, 2 September, the Prime Minister is in Scotland. I think that 30 September is too near the Party Conference.) Thursday, 30 September Thursday, 14 October Dates for the Prime Minister's Overseas Trip Thursday, 16 September - Wednesday, 29 September inclusive Party Conference Dates Tuesday, 5 October - Friday, 8 October inclusive. 21 June, 1982.

WHITMORE Economic Business in the Autumn At about this time last year, we made advance plans for the timing of Cabinet meetings - and, in particular, the timing of meetings to take public expenditure and other economic business - in the autumn. You wrote on Ministers' summer plans; this was followed by the minute of 19th May 1981 from the Chancellor of the Exchequer to the Prime Minister about the public expenditure timetable. After further exchanges, I wrote on 2nd July 1981 to Private Secretaries recording the agreed timetable. 2. This was a useful operation, which contributed to the running of the public expenditure discussions in the autumn by ensuring that key Ministers were available for decisive meetings. I suggest that it would be helpful to repeat it this year. Sir Robert Armstrong has minuted the Prime Minister separately about the Chancellor of the Exchequer's proposal that there should be a wide-ranging discussion of public expenditure in the longer term. We also understand that Treasury officials are putting proposals to the Chancellor of the Exchequer about the timetable for economic business during the second half of this year (and, in fact, the first part of next). We are keeping in touch with the Treasury's thinking on this, and will in due course offer detailed advice and a programme of dates. In the meantime, subject to the Prime Minister's views, it might be convenient if you were to write to the Private Offices of Cabinet Ministers on the lines of your letter of 29th April 1981, putting them on notice that, as the Prime Minister's programme of overseas visits permits, they can expect there to be a number of Cabinet meetings in September and the early part of October. This time last year I wrote to you on the Prime Minister's instructions to draw her colleagues' attention to the need to ensure that Government business could continue to be discharged efficiently during the summer recess. She expressed the hope that most senior Ministers would be able to take their holiday in August, soon after the House rose, so that it would be possible to return to a regular pattern of business in Cabinet and its main committees early in September. She asked colleagues to plan their recess movements with this in mind, and she stressed that the Parliamentary situation was not one which required Ministers to confine working visits overseas to the recess.

The Prime Minister would now like to remind colleagues that the same considerations apply this year. It will be still more important to ensure that business can be disposed of effectively in September, as she and the Foreign and Commonwealth Secretary will be away for the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting in the first part of October. The Prime Minister's present intention is to hold Cabinet meetings on 10, 17 and 24 September, and she therefore hopes that most Cabinet Ministers can plan to be available in this country on those dates. In the case of those who will need to be abroad in September, the Prime Minister would wish them to ensure that their deputies are available to help maintain the smooth conduct of Government business. I should also be grateful if we here could have early warning of any necessary prolonged absences by Cabinet Ministers in the period from 7 to 25 September.

I am sending copies of this letter to the Private Secretaries to members of the Cabinet, the Chief Whip and the Attorney General and to David Wright (Cabinet Office).

Ministers will no doubt soon be considering both their summer holiday plans and proposals for official visits overseas which might take place during the summer recess.

Before these plans get too advanced, the Prime Minister has asked me to draw her colleagues' attention to the need to ensure that Government business can continue to be discharged efficiently during the recess. It often proved difficult in the summer and early autumn of last year to hold Cabinet or main Cabinet Committee meetings because so many Ministers were away from London. Prime Minister appreciates that colleagues will need a reasonable holiday in the summer. She hopes that most senior Ministers will be able to take a break in August soon after the House rises. She plans herself to get away for a while in August and is likely to be out of London on official business in the first week in September. Thereafter, she expects to return to a regular pattern of business in Cabinet and the main Committees, and she would like colleagues to plan their movements with this in mind.

A number of Ministers may be thinking of working visits overseas in addition to holidays. The Prime Minister has asked me to emphasise that the Parliamentary situation is not one which requires Ministers to confine working visits to the recess. Whilst there are other factors which may make longer overseas visits more practicable in the recess, the Prime Minister would hope that Cabinet Ministers can nonetheless keep any visits as brief as possible. She would, in any case, like to ensure that there are not too many such visits concentrated in September and early October.


It would therefore be helpful if Ministers could bear these points in mind when planning their travel. In the case of those who will need to be away in September and October, the Prime Minister would wish them to ensure that their deputies are available to help maintain the smooth conduct of Government business. I should also be grateful if we here could have early warning of any necessary prolonged absences by Cabinet Ministers after the first week of September.

I am sending copies of this letter to the Private Secretaries to members of the Cabinet including the Minister of Transport, the Chief Whip, and to the Legal Secretary and Sir Robert Armstrong.
