

PRIME MINISTER'S VISIT TO COPENHAGEN

I am writing to confirm that the Prime Minister will be attending the European Council meeting in Copenhagen on 4 and 5 December.

The Prime Minister and her party will leave London on Thursday 3 December and return on the evening of Saturday 5 December.

During this period, the Private Office will be situated at the Sheraton Copenhagen Hotel, where the party will be staying.

A second Private Office will be set up at the Eigtveds Pakhus Conference Building where discussions are scheduled to take place. The Party will alternate between the two, depending upon where the Prime Minister is at the time.

All signal traffic will be passed to the relevant Private Office via the British Embassy in Copenhagen. A safehand run will operate between the Private Offices as and when required.

As usual, conference related intelligence material will be selected by the Foreign and Commonwealth Office while threat related intelligence material should be sent to us for passing to 10 Downing Street, who will decide whether it should be forwarded to Copenhagen. Any material which may be sent will be securely locked overnight in the Private Office which will be manned during silent hours by the Royal Military Police.

The Duty Clerk for the trip will be Mr Derek Kerr and the Garden Room Girl will be Miss Elizabeth Lambert. Both will effectively act as COMSOs at all times until the Private Office is closed at the end of the day. During silent hours, Charles Powell, the Prime Minister's Private Secretary will act as COMSO. All three are cleared for access to Category III material.

European Council Copenhagen: 4-5 December 1987

Travel Arrangements

An RAF VC10 has been booked to transport the Prime Minister, the Foreign and Commonwealth Secretary and members of the party from London to Copenhagen on 3 December and return on 5 December.

Outward on Thursday 3 December

The European Council meeting starts at 1000 hours on Friday 4 December. You are considering a bilateral meeting between the Prime Minister and Chancellor Kohl, possibly on the previous evening before the European Council. When a time for the meeting has been fixed, we will submit a timetable for the flight. Flying time is 1 hour 45 minutes. Local times are London = GMT, Copenhagen = GMT + 1.

Return on 5 December

The European Council is formally scheduled to end with a lunch at 1300 hours followed by the Presidency's Press Conference and the Prime Minister's own Press Conference.

Although the Presidency hope that the the meeting will end on schedule, they are ready for it to continue late in to Saturday evening (they are making contingency arrangements to provide dinner). They say they have no intention of breaking on Saturday night to resume on Sunday. We therefore recommend that the RAF VC10 should go initially on standby for departure at 1800 hours; a take off at that time would give an arrival time at London Heathrow (Southside) of 1850 hours. (Flying time: 1 hour 50 minutes.) Taking into account the crew duty hours the very latest take-off time could be 0500 hours on 6 December.

/Accommodation

Accommodation

The Suites and rooms at the Sheraton Hotel have been provisionally booked for the nights of 3-5 December inclusive. The Presidency has advised the Delegations to retain their accommodation for the night of 5 December. So far only the French have reserved rooms for the extra night. The following communications have been requested:

1. TELEGRAMS

These will be passed by secure links using the FCO networks via the Embassy. A permanent communications watch will be maintained throughout the visit.

2. SPEECH

a. An international direct private wire between the No 10 switchboard and the No 10 Private Office, Room 3 on the 14th floor, of the Sheraton Copenhagen Hotel. At the hotel, switching arrangements to extend the private wire to the UK Delegation Office at the Eigtveds Pakhus Conference Building and, if practical, to provide alternative switching arrangements to extend it to the FCO Private Office in Room 2 on the 14th floor of the hotel;

b. An extension from the Embassy Telephone Switchboard into the UK Delegation Office in the Conference Centre. This will allow calls to Embassy extensions and will also provide an additional facility for calls with the UK;

c. Additional dial-up lines with international direct dialling facilities to be installed as follows:

- one in each of the two rooms allocated as Delegation Offices.

- In the hotel 14th floor, 1 each in rooms 1, (Senior Officials) 2, (FCO) 3, (No 10 Private Office) 11, (PS to PM) and 25 (PS to S of S).

- In the hotel, 15th floor Suite 10 (PM's Suite).

d. Brahms can be used on the other three lines to provide secure speech facilities. Brahms will be connected, as required by the FCO resident engineer at Copenhagen;

e. Telephone numbers will be notified in due course by FCO, Protocol Department;

f. Hand-held radios. Clearance has been sought for the use of radios for administrative control. The equipments will be provided by the FCO and arrangements will be made locally by the FCO resident engineer at the Embassy. A second set of hand-held radios will be used by Protection Officers and clearance has been sought for their use also.



EUROPEAN COUNCIL MEETING COPENHAGEN 4-5 DECEMBER 1987:
COMMUNICATIONS

1. I have ordered an international PW from British Telecom International (BTI) between the No 10 switchboard and the No 10 Private Office, Room 3 on the 14th floor, of the Sheraton Copenhagen Hotel. At the hotel there should be switching on the PW to allow it to be extended to:

i. The UK Delegation Office in the Language Centre building adjoining the Eigtveds Pakhus Conference building (in the larger of the two rooms which have been allocated);

ii. Room 2 on the 14th floor of the hotel (this facility to switch to room 2 can be omitted if it presents any problems).

2. The arrangement for the international PW is different from those made in December 1982. At that time the PW terminated first in the Conference Centre with a further switch to the hotel. However, since there seems to be a possibility that the UK party might arrive on the evening of 3 December and go straight to the Hotel, I think it is preferable that the PW terminates there first. Once again, if this arrangement causes any difficulty I would not object if it terminated first in the Conference Centre provided it could be confirmed that the PW will be switched initially through to the hotel.

3. It would be useful to also have an extension from the Embassy switchboard into the Conference Centre (this was arranged last time). The PW should terminate, using an Embassy telephone instrument, in the same room as the international PW in the Conference Centre.

We shall require, in addition to the PWs, DELs with IDD facilities as follows:

CONFERENCE CENTRE - One in each of the two rooms allocated as Delegation Offices.

IN THE HOTEL, 14TH FLOOR - One each in rooms 1, 2, 3, 11 and 25.

IN THE HOTEL, 15TH FLOOR - Suite 10.

5. BRAHMS will be carried by the No 10 Private Office to allow secure speech with London. I shall be grateful if you will connect this, as required, to the DEL in either the Conference Centre or the No 10 Private Office in the hotel.

6. I attach a copy of the order I have placed with British Telecom for the international circuit. Will you please place a reciprocal order with the local PTT for the international PW, Embassy extension and the DELs listed above. The Conference is scheduled for 4-5 December and I would normally ask for the communications to be in place by 0001 hours on the first day and to terminate at 2359 hours on the last day. However, there is a possibility that the UK party may travel on the 3rd so we should make arrangements for them to be in place one day earlier. I should like a copy of the order for file reference in due course please.

7. The UK share of the international PW will be settled with BTI. I shall be grateful if you would make arrangements for the Embassy to settle the local bills with the Danish PTT and I will make arrangements to repay this to the FCO.

8. If you would like to discuss these arrangements my telephone is 01-270-0402. Thank you for your help.

In your letter to me of 28 September you recorded that the Prime Minister had suggested to Mr Schluter that the European Council might start at 0930 on 4 December.

If Mr Schluter takes up this suggestion, the Prime Minister could still travel to Copenhagen on the morning of Friday 4 December, going straight from the airport to the meeting. But the Prime Minister may wish to consider travelling out the night before so as to have time for private discussion with President Mitterrand and Chancellor Kohl and with Mr Schluter before the meeting begins. The enclosed timetable would allow for a meeting or a working dinner with Mr Schluter on the Thursday evening and for a breakfast with President Mitterrand or Chancellor Kohl the next morning. The Foreign Secretary believes that such meetings would give the Prime Minister a useful opportunity to steer the other key participants in the European Council towards the conclusions we want.

If the Prime Minister agrees, we will find out what Mitterrand's and Kohl's travel plans are. The Foreign Secretary thinks that a meeting with Mr Schluter would anyway be useful, particularly after our experience with Mr Martens' unguided chairmanship in June.
