PRIME MINISTER'S VISIT TO LAKE MAGGIORE,
21 OCTOBER 1988, FOR THE ANGLO-ITALIAN SUMMIT

I am writing to confirm details of the Prime Minister's forthcoming visit to Lake Maggiore for the Anglo-Italian Summit.

The Party will leave London for Milan on the morning of 21 October and will move on from there to the VILLA TARANTO where the No 10 Private Office will be set up.

The Party will include a Duty Clerk, Mr K A Harrison, and a Garden Room Girl, Mrs S Reinholt-Webb. They are both Gamma briefed, cleared for access to Category III material and will man the Private Office. The Private Secretary, Mr C D Powell, will act as Comso for the visit.

BRAHMS secure speech equipment will be available for use in the Private Office, but it is important to note that while the link will be secure the overall security is only as secure as the office in the Villa Taranto and, subsequently, people have been warned to use with care. Secure telegraph communications will not be provided for this short duration flight.

As usual, intelligence material relating to the visit will be selected by the Foreign and Commonwealth Office, while threat related intelligence material should be sent to us for passing to 10 Downing Street, who will decide whether the information should be forwarded.

The Party will return to London on the afternoon of 21 October.



1. Secure telegraph communications will not be provided for this short duration flight.

FACSIMILE


BRAHMS SECURE SPEECH

7. NOTE: The Brahms link will be secure but the overall security is only as secure as the office in the Villa Tarranto. We do not know what precautions may have been taken to ensure the technical security of the environment so the Brahms should be used with care.
