SCHEDULE OF MINISTERIAL VISITS OVERSEAS FOR EXPORT PROMOTION PURPOSES

SCHEDULE OF MINISTERIAL VISITS OVERSEAS FOR EXPORT PROMOTION PURPOSES

Last month your office received an updated schedule of ministerial visits overseas, prepared by the Official Committee on Exports (EX(0)(88) 6 - further copy attached). The purpose of the schedule is to facilitate co-ordination of Ministerial efforts on export promotion. The Chairman of EX(0) (Mr Dell of DTI) has asked whether in future any of the Prime Minister's proposed visits overseas which have an export promotion element could be included in this schedule. There would appear to be some benefit in including the Prime Minister's plans in the schedule, so long as this was consistent with security requirements and other considerations of confidentiality.

2. I understand that, when this question was asked some time ago, one of your predecessors said your office would consider whether any information could be released to EX(0) about the Prime Minister's plans each time a six monthly trawl notice was circulated. The next such notice will be issued in November/December. I would be grateful if you could let me know in due course whether you think this remains the most appropriate arrangement. An alternative might be to let the chairman of EX(0) have the relevant information on a personal basis.

I enclose the Ninth EX(0) Report to the Prime Minister on prospects for major civil contracts in the overseas projects field. The Report reflects the position in September.

Major Successes

2 Despite a continuing difficult climate for project business, the following contracts worth £20m or more are among successes achieved since the last Report:

Other Successes

3 Smaller contracts won include: the sale of 8 Airbus A320s to Australia (UK value £15m); 3 Airbus A310s (\$18m) and 8 Shorts SD360 aircraft (\$25m) to China; Rolls Royce engines for Airbus aircraft to Cyprus (£10m); airport expansion work in Dubai (£9m); the sale of gas plants to Hong Kong by Babcock Woodall Duckham (£18m); and the sale of television equipment to Singapore by GEC (£15m).

Project Climate

4 Conditions for project business remain difficult worldwide: with investment in industrialised countries low, the market has tended to concentrate on the developing world. And in many developing countries economic difficulties continue to generate pressure to curtail investment plans. Consequently, competition for the business available is intense. For many major projects British companies now find themselves in competition not only with traditional suppliers such as France, West Germany and Japan, but also with newly industrialising countries such as Korea and, increasingly, with indigenous manufacturers. To succeed, companies must meet very tough prices. Increasingly, there is little chance of success, even when our companies may be competitive in all other respects, unless a finance package can be provided that matches that made available by competitors.

Geographical Opportunities

5 Significant project opportunities continue to concentrate in a relatively small number of markets. South East and South Asia provide the clearest opportunities, both immediately and as markets of future potential. But, for these same reasons, Japan,

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the US and other industrialised countries are aggressively trying to strengthen their position in the arena. The new soft loan facility will be an important instrument in matching the practices of these other countries, though some markets, such as China, are slow and difficult to bring to decisions on particular projects. India, however, remains a promising market, but again one where our competitors are focusing more effort.

6 The prospects for major project business in much of Africa and Latin America remain poor. Many of these countries suffer from serious economic difficulties, including the problems of indebtedness, and ECGD cover is severely restricted. No significant improvement is foreseen in the short term.

7 Between these two areas of high and low promise, there are a number of markets - in the Middle East, Eastern Europe and the developed world - which offer significant project opportunities to companies with the relevant expertise and the necessary commitment. A number of major project opportunities in the Soviet Union are expected to be implemented under the Five Year Plan for 1986-90.

Sectoral Analysis

8 Looked at by project sector:

(a) In the transport field, UK companies have had success in various parts of South East Asia. Henry Boot won a large (£45m) contract for trackwork for the mass rapid transit project in Singapore while Westinghouse won a smaller one for re-signalling a section of the Thai State Railways, as well as another contract for signalling work on the Singapore MRT project. In Hong Kong, the loss of the contract to construct the Tuen Mun light rail transit system was offset to some degree when Met Cam recently won a £30m contract to supply follow-on electric trains to the Kowloon and Canton Railway Corporation.

(b) The power generation and transmission sector remains fiercely competitive with very low prices being the order of the day - largely being led downwards by the Japanese. Nevertheless, both NEI and GEC have achieved successes with contracts for turbine generators in Iraq and India. During the next 12 months UK companies will compete strongly for projects in many parts of the world including China, Mexico, Egypt, Indonesia, Iraq, Jordan and Malaysia.

(c) The UK has some major hydro power successes to build on, and should be well placed to participate in new projects to the extent that we are able to provide financial support. In view of the level of local costs involved and the scale of the overall resources required for larger projects, co-financing with multi-lateral agencies or collaboration on construction and financing with other Western countries may well become increasingly necessary.

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(d) The process plant sector remains depressed and competition for the available business is intense. The balance of advantage is tipping ever more towards the buyer and increasing ingenuity is required to construct acceptable financial packages. British contractors are giving particular attention to the Soviet petro-chemical/chemical and the Chinese metallurgical industries where there are ambitious plans for modernisation and/or expansion.

(e) Continuing low mineral prices mean that projects in the mining sector are tending to move forward more slowly, if at all. However, there are some big projects in prospect (e.g coal projects in India and China, a copper project in Papua New Guinea). The UK has strengths to exploit, but competition remains intense.

(f) Progress in the telecommunications sector remains slow, principally because of the market penetration achieved by Sweden, Japan and France in digital applications before the UK System X has been proven. There are a number of opportunities, however, in digital microwave transmission, optical fibre technology transfer, and consultancy which could result in major business.

(g) The educational equipment sector continues to grow in interest. A major success was a £65m contract, won by a UK consortium led by Philip Harris International, to equip the Sultan Qaboos University in Oman. Other opportunities in Indonesia and Mexico are being pursued.

9 I attach a list of projects lost since the last report was compiled. Whilst there is no consistent pattern, financial terms were an important factor in a significant number of cases and UK companies are undoubtedly becoming increasingly frustrated by losing to what appears to be non-commercial bidding by competitors benefiting from Governmental assistance.

10 I am copying this to the Private Secretaries of Ministers whose Departments are regular participants in EX(O) and to the Cabinet Office.



4 As you will note, the majority of these overseas projects has been lost on the issue of pricing. However, in several cases - notably the Stanwell Power Station (Australia) and the Soligorsh Potash Mine (USSR) - we have it on good authority that some form of covert concessionary financial support was used to help clinch these contracts. This is a growing feature of the increasingly fierce competition for overseas projects which is intensified by deteriorating trading conditions, particularly in developing markets. The cancellation or postponement of some 20 projects since the last EX(O) report reflects the financial difficulties currently being experienced by a number of developing countries.

5 I am copying this letter to the Private Secretaries of Ministers whose Departments are regular participants in EX(O) and to Richard Hatfield, (Cabinet Office).

Since the last EX(0) Report the framework agreement covering the Rihand Power Station in India, (UK value approximately £300m), has been transformed into a firm contract. However, the reported Taiwan order for supply of NEI turbine generators (UK value £50m) has been suspended, due to a decision by the Taiwanese to postpone the project following a re-appraisal of their future energy requirements.

MINISTERIAL VISITS ABROAD: EX(O)

1. Mr Hurd has asked me to comment on Jonathan Rees's letter of 22 April about the views of the EX(O) Committee on the areas and countries to be visited by Cabinet Ministers in the course of 1982.
2. Mr Hurd appreciates that the views expressed in the letter are taken from the standpoint of promoting our trading interests. But he considers that it would be unwise to accept them unconditionally in case they are read as part of a change of Government policy. Many other factors have of course to be taken into account in deciding on the visiting programme, and these must not be overlooked.
3. As to the three exceptions listed in paragraph 1 of Rees's letter, we agree that a greater trade promotional content might be built into the programme for Cabinet (and other) Ministers visiting Western and Southern Europe. We would expect the Department of Trade to put forward proposals to this effect in the Ministerial Visits Committee, and to recommend whether visiting Ministers might be accompanied by businessmen.
4. For Eastern Europe, a Cabinet level trade visit to Czechoslovakia has not been under consideration. The Foreign and Commonwealth Secretary had in fact agreed to visit Prague. While there he would have raised any relevant trade matters, but these would not have been the primary purpose of his visit. It is now likely that this visit will be postponed beyond the end of the year.
5. Although there has been a significant number of Ministerial visits to the Middle East, there is little danger of that area being 'over-visited'. There has certainly been a spate of such visits to the Gulf and Iraq over the last two years. But this programme came about largely because of the criticism in the Gulf that after our withdrawal in 1971 we have virtually ignored

/the area



the area. We did so to our cost: our competitors, in particular the French, moved in and developed close and profitable relations with states which had traditionally looked to the United Kingdom. The recent programme of senior Ministerial visits has helped to rectify this situation, and we should dispute any suggestion that the number of visits to the area be reduced. Indeed for several countries, for example Kuwait, the problem will be to keep up the impetus which we have created and which has certainly proved useful. The small countries in the Gulf attach disproportionate importance to Ministerial visits, and though we may regard them as rather small fry they do have large purses. And they tend to buy from people they like.

Dear Mike,

One of the subjects considered at the last EX(0) meeting was the forward planning of overseas visits by Cabinet Ministers from the standpoint of advancing UK trade interests. In reviewing the programme of visits for 1982 the Committee concluded that the balance struck in the worldwide spread of planned visits was about right (especially when visits by other UK Ministers are taken into account) except that:-

- (i) Cabinet Ministers' visits to Western Europe now tended to be mainly political in character, and that a greater trade promotional content would be desirable;
- (ii) In Eastern Europe, a Cabinet Minister level trade visit to Czechoslovakia was barely justified and one such trade visit to Yugoslavia was adequate; and
- (iii) The Middle East was in danger of being over-visited.

The Committee agreed that Departments primarily concerned should be asked to take these observations into account in shaping future visit schedules; hence this letter.

To elaborate a little on Western Europe, trade promotion in this area demands a somewhat different approach to that in lesser developed countries, where often most mileage is gained from discussions with Ministers' opposite numbers in Government. A few pointers on how Ministers could best advance our interests in the European arena might therefore be useful.

We have some project interests in Greece, and, to a lesser extent, Portugal. Consequently, it would be prudent to ensure contact at Ministerial level in both countries, for, while no positive advantage may be secured, lack of such contact would adversely affect UK's chances of winning contracts.

Greece and Portugal, apart, there is little project work available in Continental West European countries for foreign contractors. Here the advice is to concentrate visits on events and organisations with industrial and trading significance following careful preparation and timing. For example visits could usefully be arranged to coincide with the opening of joint venture enterprises, the signing of commercial agreements, or the delivery of some big UK orders. With an eye to the longer term, visits to important foreign companies, influential trade associations and Chambers of Commerce can be helpful in creating a favourable climate for potential collaboration, or breakthrough into a sector.



From the Secretary of State

As for market priorities, trade potential, rather than just current performance, would be our criterion. This puts Germany, Italy and France at the top of the list, with the addition of Spain when commercial relations improve. Although not accorded top priority, other Western European markets should not of course be ignored.

Practically all these successful UK bids have benefitted to varying degrees from Government support services. In several cases, such as the Hong Kong Mass Transit Railway, the Department of Trade has been closely involved in putting together acceptable financial packages, deploying a number of measures in the process. In others, such as Qaboos University and the Seoul Metro, Ministers, from the Prime Minister downwards, have played a vital part in securing the contracts by intervening at crucial stages in the negotiations.

We shall write separately to provide a situation report on the Orissa steel plant as the Prime Minister has requested.

We spoke last week about Mr Rees's letter to you of 23 December. We have also received from DOT an up-dating report on progress with the original exercise (para. 3 below). As promised, I attach a draft reply.

2. The background is briefly as follows.

3. The letter originates from a "Rayner project" carried out in 1979 by Dr J Spencer: in announcing changes to Parliament on 30 April 1980, Mr Nott, the then Secretary of State, spoke of a report on DOT's services to exporters "prepared under the guidance of Sir Derek Rayner". Dr Spencer estimated that savings would be about £10m pa, mostly from increased charges, and that staff savings would be somewhere between 75 and 110 posts.

4. Mr Nott's Answer identified two sources of change:

- (1) Changes made on the advice of the British Overseas Trade Board after consultation with industry, eg in the level of subsidy to firms exhibiting in overseas trade fairs, in the number of outward missions and in the administration of the Export Intelligence Service.
- (2) The organisation of the export promotion work of the DOT, to which Mr Nott said that he was giving further consideration. (The location cost of the re-organisation is £0.25m, once-for-all.)

5. Mr Rees's letter is about organisation alone and says little about the "significant savings in expenditure and staff" which Mr Nott's Answer indicated would be made as a result of the changes outlined in 4(1) above. In the press notice from BOTB which accompanied Mr Nott's Answer, savings were described

as follows:

- (1) BOTB manpower to be reduced by 100 posts over the two years 1980-81 and 1981-82. In fact, 103 posts have been retrenched at an annual saving of £0.8m.
- (2) Direct expenditure reduced by c. £1.8m in 1980-81; £4m in 1981-82; £4.9m in 1982-83; and £5.8m in 1983-84. (BOTB estimated that in 1981-82 it would recover from charges about 18% of the total cost of services for which charges were made and 6.6% of the total cost of export promotion services at home and overseas.)

In fact, savings in annual expenditure will amount to £9m in 1985-86 despite a decision not to make a 100% recovery of full costs from long-standing participants in joint ventures at international trade fairs (a saving foregone of up to £4m).

- || 6. As action on the 1979 project now appears to be complete, it seems sensible for the proposed Answer to say so and to give a complete picture.

Dear Willie,

My Secretary of State thought that the Prime Minister would be interested in a report on the major re-organisation of the trade promotion work within this Department which is to be announced on 18 January. This has been progressively carried out over the last 18 months and the whole new structure will be in place by mid-January. The occasion will be marked by a written answer to an arranged PQ and appropriate press publicity.

The initial impetus for this re-organisation came from within the Department but was helped by the Rayner study of services to exporters. This drew attention to a number of features in the then organisation which could give rise to duplication and an excessive gap between policy making, execution and feed-back on export promotion. Mr Nott (then Secretary of State for Trade), in announcing to Parliament his conclusions on this Rayner report in April 1980, said that he was giving further consideration to these issues.

The export promotion work of the Department of Trade is carried out under the general guidance of the British Overseas Trade Board. The views of the 150 businessmen who give their time to the British Overseas Trade Board and its various supporting geographical groups (eg the Committee on Middle East Trade) have been fully taken into account in formulating the underlying principles for the re-organisation and in translating these into the new structure. The role of the British Overseas Trade Board itself remains unaltered but the new arrangements provide for more effective linkage between it and the Department.



From the Secretary of State

The guiding principles underlying the re-organisation have been:-

- (a) To deal with the problems identified in the Rayner study.
- (b) To provide a stronger market orientation to the export services, thus improving the linkages with the commercial staff in Embassies and High Commissions overseas.
- (c) To provide a limited number of functional units providing specialised services (eg the Export Intelligence Service, the organisation of British participation in overseas trade fairs and the co-ordination of Government support for overseas capital projects).
- (d) To provide for the smaller and less experienced exporter a series of regional offices throughout the United Kingdom which can give direct help and assist access to the various branches and facilities available within the Department of Trade.
- (e) To bring together in one building the bulk of the headquarters trade promotion staff of the Department.

In translating these principles into the new structure we have borne in mind the need for the Government's export promotion activities to be concentrated on those things which the Government itself is uniquely able to provide. In essence this means the provision to exporters of the wide range of advice and information which the Government alone can provide because of the presence of commercial staff overseas with access to information of commercial value and to people whose influence can benefit our exporters. In addition, there is a limited number of specific services to exporters, where either the scale of activity or the skills required make it desirable to provide a Government involvement. Both of these factors were highlighted in the Rayner study.

The first step in the re-organisation was to bring together under one Deputy Secretary (who also acts as the Chief Executive of the British Overseas Trade Board) all divisions responsible for our bilateral commercial relations with other countries and for providing services and advice to exporters. The number of divisions was also reduced from six to five. This has enabled two open structure posts to be saved.

The second step was the creation last year (as one of the five divisions) of the Projects and Export Policy Division charged with the task of integrating the full range of Government services in support of industry's pursuit of capital projects overseas.



From the Secretary of State

There then followed the first of the new style market branches handling all information for exporters about a specific geographical area and providing the focal point both for Posts overseas and exporters at home pursuing business in that area. This was the Exports to Europe Branch which is currently carrying out a major campaign throughout the country to stimulate increased awareness of export opportunities in Western Europe. In the autumn of this year we set up a Regional Office to serve exporters in the South East and Eastern regions, thus completing the full coverage of regional offices. The final step to be completed by mid-January is the creation of the remaining market branches and the move of the bulk of the headquarters staff to Number 1 Victoria Street, the headquarters of the Department of Trade, thus making it possible to surrender expensive office accommodation in the City.

This new structure should provide a more efficient service for assisting our country's exporters. The re-brigading of the various services and functions into an integrated group of five Overseas Trade Divisions under one Deputy Secretary should also mean that this Department's contribution to the overall Civil Service manpower reductions required by March 1984 can be made with minimum in-roads into the real help we provide to exporters.

I am sending a copy of this letter to the Private Secretaries of members of EX Committee, of Sir Robert Armstrong and of Sir Derek Rayner.

Dear Michael,

My Secretary of State thought that the Prime Minister would welcome a first report on the work of the Official Committee on Exports, EX(O), set up in June this year. At the same time my Secretary of State is providing the Prime Minister with the first of the quarterly reports on major civil overseas sales prospects which she requested.

EX(O)'s job is to co-ordinate the commercial aspects of Prime Ministerial and other senior Ministerial visits abroad. To do this with economy and efficiency the Committee decided:-

- (a) to confine itself to overseas visits by Cabinet Ministers only;
- (b) to identify well in advance those visits with a significant commercial potential and then to set the main commercial objectives and pick out any obstacles to be overcome in advance of the visits;
- (c) to appoint a Department of Trade-led task force to prepare the commercial tactics and brief for the visit - and to ensure that any obstacles are overcome in time;
- (d) to consider all commercial briefs for visits by the Prime Minister before they are finally submitted by the Department of Trade.

In shaping commercial preparations for the six visits covered so far, EX(O) has focused Ministerial support where it could have a real influence on securing commercial benefits for United Kingdom firms. In particular problems on the financial front have been resolved before the visit. For example, before the Prime Minister's visits to Bahrain/Kuwait and to Pakistan, export credit cover for these countries was reviewed, and an increase for Pakistan agreed.



From the Secretary of State

The quarterly reports on major civil overseas sales prospects has been compiled under OX(O)'s direction in consultation with other Departments. It highlights those with a potential United Kingdom content of £50m or more and which may need support action by Ministers.

There have been three recent major United Kingdom successes - the Indian coastal steel plant (United Kingdom content £550m+), the Anzcan cable (United Kingdom content £170m) and the Mexican Sicartsa plate steel mill (United Kingdom content £190m). But, at this stage, the list is bound to be wide, and a more precise view of prospects can only become clear as events develop. Some have special importance, among which are:-

- (a) Guangdong Nuclear Power Station: a potential United Kingdom content of up to £500m, but depends upon Chinese decisions in a period of economic re-appraisal, and on their choice of contractor for the nuclear element: we are keeping the options open to take the best advantage of the importance of Hong Kong to the project's viability.
- (b) Egypt, Cairo Wastewater Project: a Memorandum of Understanding was signed earlier this year, and there is a considerable United Kingdom potential for follow-on orders (depending on the latest political developments).
- (c) Hong Kong, Chek Lap Kok Airport: potential United Kingdom return of £300m-£500m, and an important "shop-window" project. The initial consultancy has regrettably been won by a United States-led group, but a United Kingdom consortium is being formed for the main contracts.
- (d) India, Coal-fired Power Station: depends on the Indian government's readiness to consider a negotiated contract, in which the aid component could be crucial as the Indian authorities have aid-supported proposals from the Russians, Italians and others. The provision of support from the CEBG is also an important factor, and the United Kingdom manufacturers have combined into a single group to bid for the project.

- (e) Indonesia: is a growing economy, and a market where the United Kingdom has to date achieved few major contracts. A number of projects are currently being pursued, including a cold rolling mill for Krakatau Steel; the Mrica-Maung hydro-electric projects; and the Gresik fertiliser project. All, however, are facing aggressive competition.
- (f) Iraq: two railway projects are particularly noteworthy:-
- Baghdad Metro: a consortium of United Kingdom consultants have been awarded the initial design work (alone worth £34m) and United Kingdom contractors are being encouraged to organise themselves effectively to exploit the large potential business (some £100m).
- Main Line Railway Development: this project has a potential value of £1 billion, and United Kingdom companies are working out the formation of a joint effort.
- (g) Kuwait, Olefins/aromatic plant: a £1 billion project, but confronting strong competition.
- (h) Qatar, Development of North Gas Field: this, the largest potential gas development in the world, is fraught with problems, but BP and Shell are aiming to gain participation shares. With the consultant/management function almost sure to go to one of the major United States contractors, it will be difficult for United Kingdom firms to gain major shares, but industry is being encouraged to focus its effort.
- (i) System X: the world potential for sales of digital telecommunications is vast. But, by virtue of being several years behind the competition in market availability, special measures are likely to be needed to secure a market presence.

Beyond these, the projects listed are being pursued by United Kingdom companies, and Government support action is being considered as identified in the report. Special features will be submitted to Ministers and full tactical advantage will be taken of Ministerial visits as part of the Government support.

PROJECT EXPORTS

At a recent reception the Prime Minister mentioned to Mr Parkinson the need for British industry to secure export orders.

This is of course a prime preoccupation for us. But Mr Parkinson thought that the Prime Minister might be interested to see a few figures showing how successful, despite the fierce competitive climate, the UK can be in the major project field. I therefore attach at Annex A a list of major projects secured by UK companies in the past year with active Government support. I also attach two lists, at Annexes B and C, showing major contracts, of the sort which do not get headlines, secured over the last six months. There are also some particular markets, such as Iraq, where, apart from the examples in other Annexes, we have made substantial progress through a combination of Government and commercial effort - see Annex D.

Inevitably, these major contracts attract great attention. But Mr Parkinson has asked me to point out that these important projects are the tip of the iceberg; and the bulk of our exports consist of much smaller scale day-to-day business.

In your letter of 7 May to the Department of Trade you recorded the Prime Minister's views on the need for proper advance preparation of all aspects of Ministerial visits abroad and noted that I was considering the establishment of machinery which might facilitate both this co-ordination and the follow-up to Ministerial visits. I have now had the opportunity of discussing this with the Permanent Secretaries of the departments directly concerned. They agree with me that on balance the establishment of a new Official Committee on Exports would be an improvement to the present co-ordination arrangements.

2. I am therefore making arrangements for this new Official Committee - to be designated EX(O) - to be established immediately with the following terms of reference:-

"To provide for interdepartmental co-ordination of the commercial aspects of Prime Ministerial and other senior Ministerial visits abroad and to report on such export matters as the Ministerial Committee on Exports may refer to it."

3. The Committee will be chaired by a Deputy Secretary from the Department of Trade, and will have representatives, generally at Under-Secretary level, from the Foreign and Commonwealth Office, the Treasury, the Ministry of Defence, the Departments of Industry and Trade, the Cabinet Office, CPRS, the No 10 Policy Unit and the Export Credit Guarantee Department.

4. Day-to-day problems and the detailed planning of Ministerial visits will continue to be handled by the existing machinery. Defence sales matters will be for the newly-established Ministerial Committee on Defence Sales. But the establishment of this new Official Committee should mean that in the future different elements in this country's trading relations with individual countries will be more effectively co-ordinated in planning Ministerial visits, as the Prime Minister has proposed. The Committee will also aim to submit regular reports to Ministers indicating which current contracts are being monitored by the Committee and which are likely to need the assistance of a Ministerial visit.

FOLLOW-UP TO THE GULF VISIT

You wrote to me on 7 May about follow-up to the Prime Minister's ^{1 July} ~~5/6~~ trip to the Gulf and more generally about ministerial visits.

My Secretary of State, of course, accepts that Ministerial visits should be arranged with particular objectives in mind. The commercial objectives of any visits will cover a wide spectrum of cases. At one extreme - and these will probably be rare - are Government to Government contracts where Ministers are likely to play a leading role. At the other there are the more straightforward trade promotion visits (often with a team of businessmen) to help open doors in new markets or to support British presences at trade fairs.

On those visits where a Minister is accompanied by businessmen there are a number of ways in which the Ministerial presence can help. First, where companies are seeking to break into a new market or to bid for a particular contract their presence in a Ministerial party can gain them access to influential people they would not otherwise see. Secondly, where a contract is in the course of negotiation a Ministerial visit can help to iron out difficulties. And thirdly, when a contract is near to conclusion a Ministerial visit can accelerate - or even clinch - the deal. The businessmen who accompany our Ministers on their visits are carefully selected on the basis of the value to their companies of one of these forms of help.

Proper preparation is, of course, crucial to the success of any visit and this is well recognised here. Preparation includes identifying out of the hundreds of contracts which United Kingdom firms are pursuing in the world's markets those which could be materially assisted by Ministerial interventions in the course of a visit overseas.

Commercial objectives can also feature in visits arranged for other purposes - eg Lord Carrington's visit to South America last year. Department of Trade Ministers have been actively promoting the

involvement of other Ministers in support of export promotion and I expect you saw a copy of Nicholas McInnes' letter of 15 April to the Private Offices of all Cabinet Ministers which illustrates this and our desire for proper machinery to make it succeed.

As to the specific points about the Middle East, my Secretary of State agrees that a further ministerial visit to Kuwait immediately after the Prime Minister's would not be sensible. The main purpose of his October visit is to go to Iraq and we shall be writing about this nearer the time.

The Prime Minister has seen the Secretary of State for Trade's minute to her of 1 May about the follow-up to her trip to the Gulf.

The Prime Minister has made one general comment on the question of Ministerial visits overseas. In her view, such visits, including those in which she herself is involved, must be arranged with some particular objective in mind. Visits whose objective is mainly to generate goodwill achieve, in the Prime Minister's view, little if anything. It is firm agreements on policy issues and, above all, contracts that we should be pursuing.

To this end, the Prime Minister believes that more attention should be paid to the preparation of individual visits and to the concerting of series of visits. All the groundwork should be done in advance. Where contracts are at issue, all those aspects which are affected by Government decisions, e.g. ECGD terms; Industry Act aid; contractual conditions for which Government Departments are responsible, etc., need to be cleared up in advance. This will usually mean that serious and co-ordinated preparation for a Ministerial visit should begin many months before the visit takes place. (In this context, I assume that thought is already being given to the commercial aspects of the Prime Minister's forthcoming visits to Kuwait, Bahrain and Pakistan: my letter of today's date to Ian Ellison about a methanol plant project in Bahrain is relevant.) I understand that Sir Robert Armstrong is at present considering the establishment of machinery which might facilitate such co-ordination and, subsequently, follow-up.

On specific points in the Secretary of State's minute:

- (a) The Prime Minister is sceptical about the value of a further Ministerial visit to Kuwait immediately after her own visit there at the end of September;

- (b) The Prime Minister does not wish to pursue the idea of giving a keynote speech to a CBI seminar on Gulf markets. She will be addressing the CBI in mid-June and will aim to include in her speech on that occasion a passage about trade with the Gulf - and with India;
- (c) The Prime Minister would in principle be prepared to entertain the participants in the FT/CBI seminar on Saudi Arabia. However, diary considerations may make it difficult to arrange this. We will be getting in touch with you.

I am sending copies of this letter to Francis Richards (Foreign and Commonwealth Office), David Wright (Cabinet Office) and Ian Ellison (Department of Industry).

MINISTERIAL VISITS OVERSEAS: CO-ORDINATION OF TRADE PROMOTION VISITS

We have been giving some thought to the question of co-ordination of Ministerial visits overseas which could include trade promotion as an objective. Ministerial visits are an important part of our general trade promotion activities and we should like to get the best value we can out of them.

At the moment, we are not sure that our efforts are always directed at the right target at the right time. There has been a tendency for certain countries or regions to receive a considerable amount of Ministerial attention in the field of trade promotion, at least over a short period of time. That would be entirely appropriate if a conscious decision had been taken to focus Ministerial attention in such a way but we are not sure that has always been the case. Conversely, other countries or regions may be neglected, or comparatively neglected in relation to others which, again, might be quite right and proper if it were the result of a conscious decision but it is not always clear that that is so.

The principal device for keeping track of proposals for Ministerial visits is the schedule that your Department distributes monthly based on information provided by other Departments. But by the time a visit is included in the schedule, it is sometimes already beginning to take shape; there may then be insufficient time for consideration of its commercial aspects. Nor does the stage at which a Minister seeks permission for a visit from his colleagues principally concerned normally provide an early and adequate enough opportunity for Departments to express views.

Some Departments whose Ministers undertake visits with a trade promotion content (in whole or in part) as an extension of their sponsorship responsibilities already turn to our country branches for advice about where the best opportunities lie as between

particular product sectors and between different markets. We think it would be both logical and sensible to extend this arrangement and to make our country branches the primary co-ordinating point for the trade promotional aspects of any Ministerial visits. In this way we would hope, to avoid the present drawbacks I have mentioned - possible over-concentration on some markets and neglect of others - and thus help to bring about a better co-ordinated programme of Ministerial visits as a whole. If you and copy recipients agree, therefore, we should be grateful if, where trade promotion may be an objective, Departments would consult us at the earliest possible stage, both as to markets to be visited and the timing of visits. Ideally, as already happens in some instances, we should like our country branches to be consulted before internal departmental submissions to Ministers are made on any visit with a trade promotional angle.

I am sending copies of this to the Private Secretaries to Cabinet Ministers and to David Wright.
