
RE: JAMES LUKE BLACKSTONE -v- THE PRIME MINISTER

You may recall that I wrote to you on 31st March 1989 regarding a County Court summons that had been issued by one James Luke Blackstone against the Prime Minister. I issued an application to strike the matter out as being frivolous and vexatious, and that application is due to be heard on 21st June 1989.

Since that time, Mr. Blackstone has sought to join in those proceedings Mr. Neil Kinnock and the Labour Party. Further, I have today received the enclosed further summons against the Prime Minister in which he appears to be suing her for an article written in The Sun newspaper and claims £70. I intend to apply to have this matter struck out on the same grounds as the former summons, and have the application heard on the same day.

I enclose herewith a County Court summons that has been delivered to this office from the Westminster County Court, issued by one James Luke Blackstone. You will see from this that the Prime Minister is named as the Defendant.

This office has, in fact, had dealings with Mr. Blackstone before. You may recall that in July 1987 he served a summons on, amongst others, the Prime Minister, seeking an injunction to prevent the 1987 General Election going ahead. A colleague of mine was successful in having that claim struck out in the High Court.

You will see from the latest summons enclosed herewith that the first paragraph refers to an "inordinate delay" at the Wood Green DHSS in renewing the Plaintiff's pension book. I have taken the liberty of making enquiries of the Office Manager at Wood Green - he tells me that the Plaintiff has been claiming invalidity benefit since 1972. His previous pension book expired on 13th March 1989, thus a new book was to be issued to cover the period 14th March 1989 to 11th September 1989. Due to some unexplained delay, that pension book was posted first class to the Plaintiff on 20th March 1989, which happens to be the same day that the first voucher in the book would have been cashable. Thus, assuming that the pension book was delivered on the following day, it would actually have arrived one day late.

However, you will see that according to the wording on the face of the summons, the Applicant is claiming damages of £70 for "covering up serious crimes against the population, effectively suspending the constitution of the country".


In the next few days, it is my intention to issue a summons in the County Court seeking to strike out the Plaintiff's claim. The Plaintiff's mention of the inordinate delay over the delivery of his pension book is obviously a spring-board from which he

will seek to make some sort of political statement in the public forum of the Court. However, I cannot guarantee the success of my summons. It may well be that the learned Registrar would allow the Plaintiff to proceed by linking the claim for damages of £70 to the inordinate delay. In those circumstances, proper particulars of the Plaintiff's claim would be sought and the case would then be taken further on the basis of those particulars.

In the meantime, I would be grateful if you could confirm by return whether the Prime Minister is content for me to proceed in this way and act on her behalf in this matter.

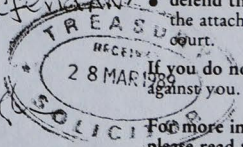

Mr. James Blackstone has taken out a Summons against the former Lord Chancellor in which he seeks to obtain an injunction to prohibit a general election for a variety of reasons. Mr. Blackstone sent No. 10 a copy of the Summons which purported to suggest that you, among others, are a party to the action as one of a considerable number of defendants. The Treasury Solicitor's Department tells us that in fact the writ was issued only against Lord Hailsham, without mention of you.

Mr. Blackstone's writ gives all the appearance of production by an unbalanced mind. Nevertheless, the legal formalities have to be pursued, and the Treasury Solicitor needs to be able to speak on your behalf at any hearing should the need arise. To do this he asks that you should sign the form of retainer immediately below.



You have passed to me, under cover of a compliment slip, a copy of a summons issued by Mr Blackstone in the above action. The summons, which is returnable before the Master on 28 July, suggests that the Prime Minister, *inter alios*, is a party to the action as one of a considerable number of defendants. The writ in the action was, however, issued against Lord Hailsham alone and I have duly entered an appearance on his behalf. Since that time, a number of copy summonses has come my way, each purporting to be addressed to others than simply Lord Hailsham, notwithstanding that I have never been served with any order by which other than Lord Hailsham has been formally joined as defendant.

For your information, I enclose herewith a copy of the writ which was issued on 11 June 1987. Although it is not appropriate that any appearance should be entered on behalf of the Prime Minister, since no writ to which she is a party, or, indeed, any writ, has been served on her, it would seem appropriate that I should be able to speak on her behalf at any hearing, should the need arise. If you agree, perhaps you would invite the Prime Minister to sign the enclosed form of retainer, which I would then ask you to return to me as soon as possible.

I have issued a summons on Lord Hailsham's behalf which is also returnable on 28 July and by which I seek an order that the endorsement on the writ be struck out as disclosing no reasonable cause of action. I shall let you know the result of my application in due course.
