

You will have seen Amman telnos 469 and 472 of 11 and 12 June (further copies enclosed) reporting that King Hussein has been admitted to hospital with heart palpitations. Our Embassy in Amman have this morning confirmed that, while there is no serious cause for concern at the moment, he is still in hospital.

We therefore recommend that the Prime Minister send a short message. I enclose a draft telegram.

In view of our recent reservations about Jordan's position during the Gulf crisis, the message makes no commitments,

We are also alerting Buckingham Palace to the King's illness.

KING HUSSEIN: HOSPITALISATION

1. THE LOCAL RADIO HAS JUST BEGUN REPORTING THAT KING HUSSEIN HAS BEEN ADMITTED TO THE KING HUSSEIN MEDICAL CENTRE WITH HEART PALPITATIONS. HIS CONDITION IS DESCRIBED AS STABLE.

2. THE KING HAS HAD A HEAVY LOAD OF CEREMONIAL DUTIES LATELY, SHAKING HANDS WITH OVER 2,500 PEOPLE ON EACH OF TWO DAYS RUNNING. WE UNDERSTAND HE MADE AN UNANNOUNCED VISIT TO HOSPITAL FOR A CHECK UP WHEN HE SHOWED SIGNS OF STRAIN SHORTLY AFTER MR BAKER'S LAST VISIT.

MY TELNO 469: KING HUSSEIN'S HEALTH

1. IN THE COURSE OF A COURTESY CALL I PAID TODAY ON THE JORDANIAN PRIME MINISTER, BADRAN TOLD ME THAT THE KING'S PROBLEM WAS AN ATRIAL FIBRILLATION WHICH HAD STARTED ON THE EVENING OF 10 JUNE. IT HAD BEEN BROUGHT ON BY EXHAUSTION. HE HAD IN FACT SHAKEN HANDS WITH 7000 WELL-WISHERS IN THREE DAYS (IN ADDITION TO ARMY DAY AND THE CEREMONY MARKING THE RATIFICATION OF THE NATIONAL CHARTER HE HAD RECEIVED A VERY LARGE NUMBER OF ARMY AND TRIBAL REPRESENTATIVES ON 8 JUNE). BADRAN SAID THAT THE PROBLEM COULD BE BROUGHT ON BY TIREDNESS, SMOKING, COFFEE OR STRESS. IN RECENT WEEKS THE KING HAD BEEN AFFECTED BY ALL FOUR. BUT HE WAS GETTING BETTER NOW. HIS PRESS SPOKESMAN TOLD REUTERS TODAY THAT HE WOULD BE OUT OF HOSPITAL WITHIN 24-48 HOURS.

2. THE KING GAVE A TELEPHONE INTERVIEW YESTERDAY WHICH WAS BROADCAST ON RADIO AND TELEVISION, PRESUMABLY TO PROVIDE REASSURANCE. I THOUGHT HIS VOICE FAR LESS STRONG AND CONFIDENT THAN USUAL: HE DID NOT SOUND IN GOOD FORM.

3. I HAVE CONVEYED A PERSONAL MESSAGE OF GOOD WISHES TO THE KING BUT I BELIEVE THAT IT WOULD BE VERY WELL RECEIVED IF I COULD CONVEY ONE ON INSTRUCTIONS FROM LONDON (TELECON BUCKNELL/ARCHER, NENAD). YOU MAY THINK THAT IT WOULD BE MOST APPROPRIATE FOR A MESSAGE TO COME EITHER FROM THE PRIME MINISTER OR FROM HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN. I WOULD SEE ADVANTAGE IN A MESSAGE FROM THE QUEEN, ESPECIALLY IF WE HAVE TO BE DISOBLIGING IN OTHER CONNECTIONS (MY TELNO 468).

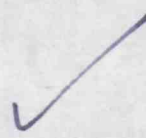

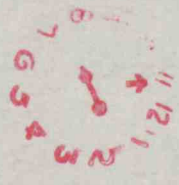
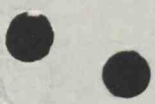

You told me this morning that the Prime Minister had it in mind to send King Hussein a personal message wishing him a speedy recovery from his illness. Amman telegram number 33 (copy enclosed) suggests that King Hussein's illness is more serious than Jordanian public announcements imply. In the circumstances, HM Ambassador thinks that King Hussein would warmly appreciate a message.

As the seriousness of the King's illness has not been publicised, we think that the message should be confidential. A draft is enclosed.

We are also considering a recommendation to the Palace that Her Majesty might also send a message.

1. YOU WILL HAVE SEEN MY SUBSEQUENT TELNO 29 ABOUT THE PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENT CONCERNING KING HUSSEIN'S ILLNESS.
2. SINCE THEN I HAVE OBTAINED IN THE STRICTEST CONFIDENCE

A FULLER

ACCOUNT OF THE KING'S ILLNESS. IT WOULD SEEM THAT THE AMERICAN VERSION IN MY TELNO 25 IS MUCH CLOSER TO THE MARK THAN THE PUBLISHED VERSION. THE KING LOST A FULL TWO PINTS OF BLOOD AND HAD TO HAVE IMMEDIATE BLOOD TRANSFUSION ON ADMITTANCE TO HOSPITAL. FOR THE SWEARING IN OF THE NEW CABINET (MY TELNO 30), HE WAS GOT OUT OF BED, DRESSED AND PUT BACK TO BED IMMEDIATELY.

OUR SOURCE

CONFIRMED THAT TWO BRITISH DOCTORS HAD ARRIVED TO TAKE CARE OF THE KING AND HE SEEMED TO DOUBT WHETHER THE KING WOULD BE WELL ENOUGH TO GO TO INDIA AT THE END OF THE MONTH. HE SAID THAT THE KING'S CONDITION WAS A RESULT OF SEVERE OVER-STRAIN. IT REMAINS TO BE SEEN WHETHER THE KING WILL BE ABLE TO OPEN PARLIAMENT ON 16 JANUARY AS NOW RESCHEDULED. I SHOULD BE GRATEFUL IF THIS INFORMATION COULD BE CLOSELY HELD.

3. IN THE CIRCUMSTANCES I THINK KING HUSSEIN WOULD WARMLY APPRECIATE A PERSONAL MESSAGE FROM THE PRIME MINISTER AND YOU MIGHT ALSO, IN VIEW OF THE FORTHCOMING STATE VISIT, WISH TO CONSIDER WHETHER THE QUEEN SHOULD SEND A MESSAGE TOO. IT IS OBVIOUSLY IMPORTANT, HOWEVER, THAT THE MESSAGES SHOULD NOT GIVE ANY INDICATION THAT WE KNOW MORE THAN WAS IN THE PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENT.

1. KING HUSSEIN SUFFERED A HAEMORRHOIDAL EPISODE ON
9 JANUARY AND WAS ADMITTED TO THE KING HUSSEIN MEDICAL
CENTRE AT 2100 HOURS SEMI COLON HPSHAD TO BE TAKEN IN ON
A STRETCHER, AFTER THE LOSS OF A GOOD DEAL OF BLOOD. HE
WAS DUE TO UNDERGO A SURGICAL INTERVENTION THIS AFTERNOON
AND I UNDERSTAND THAT TWO BRITISH DOCTORS WILL BE ARRIVING
IN AMMAN LATER THIS EVENING. NO PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENT HAS YET
BEEN MADE, BUT MY US COLLEAGUE (FROM WHOM THIS INFORMATION
CAME) BELIEVES THAT THE KING IS LIKELY TO BE OUT OF ACTION
FOR A PERIOD OF AT LEAST THREE TO FIVE DAYS.

2. VIETS HAD SEN A GOOD DEAL OF THE KING IN THE LAST WEEK,
ACCOMPANYING TWO VISITING DELEGATIONS OF US CONGRESSMEN AND
SENATORS WHOM THE KING HAD ENTERTAINED TO DINNER ON THE
EVENINGS OF 7 AND 8 JANUARY. VIETS HAD NOTED THAT THE KING
LOOKED EXTREMELY TIRED AND YELLOW. QUEEN NOOR HAD ALSO

LOOKED EXTREMELY TIRED AND YELLOW. QUEEN NOOR HAD ALSO REMARKED TO VIETS THAT THE KING WAS UNDER GREAT STRAIN AND 'WAS , AS USUAL, BOTTLING IT ALL UP''.

3. IT NOW SEEMS LIKELY THAT THE OPENING SESSION OF THE LOWER HOUSE OF THE JORDANIAN PARLIAMENT, WHICH WAS TO HAVE BEEN ADDRESSED BY TH KING ON 12 JANUARY , WILL HAVE TO BE POSTPONED UNLESS THE KING SHOULD DEPUTE SOMEONE ELSE TO READ HIS SPEECH. KING HUSSEIN HAD APPARENTLY ALREADY, PRIOR TO HIS SUDDEN ILLNESS, DECIDED THAT HE WOULD SEND CROWN PRINCE HASSAN TO ATTND THE ISLAMIC SUMMIT MEETING AT FEZ NEXT WEEK SEMI COLON HE HAD A GOOD EXCUSE NOT TO GO, AS HE WAS REQUIRED TO BE IN AMMAN IN ORDER TO RECEIVE THE FORMAL REPLY OF THE LOWER HOUSE OF PARLIAMENT TO HIS OPENING ADDRESS.

4. KING HUSSEIN HAS A MARKED TENDENCY TO FALL ILL AT TIMES WHEN HE IS UNDR GREAT STRAIN SEMI COLON THE LAST OCCASION WAS IN MARCH 1983 (MY TELS NOS 122 OF 27 MARCH AND 136 OF 30 MARCH 1983).
