- 1. I have been considering ways of ensuring that we do not repeat the problems at the last-but-one meeting of EA(LG), when some of the Ministers present had to sit behind the pillars.
- 2. This is in practice a difficulty which only arises for EA(LG). There are 25 seats at the Cabinet table, excluding the two behind the pillars, and I think that no other committee that meets in the Cabinet room has a combined membership and secretariat that is close to that number. The total complement for EA(LG), however, amounts to 22. With two No. 10 representatives and one ministerial invitee all seats are filled and any further Ministers could not be accommodated.
- 3. There is no sure-fire way of knowing in advance how many Ministers will attend. Although we have a procedure for listing expected attendance there are often last-minute boarders. The simplest and most straightforward approach for ensuring that all Ministers have a seat is therefore for the secretariat at meetings of EA(LG) to remain standing until all Ministers have arrived, and be prepared if necessary to move behind the pillars. It would be helpful if private secretaries and members of the policy unit could follow the same procedure, as they did at the last meeting of EA(LG).
- 4. Of course, if Ministers turn up after the meeting has started they may still be inappropriately seated; but I do not think that they would object in these circumstances.
 - 5. Other secretariat heads may like to check that their committees are small enough to avoid this problem.

MEETINGS IN CABINET ROOM

There was a very large attendance at EA(LG) which resulted in some Ministers having to sit at the Secretariat table while you and Sarah sat at one side of the Prime Minister, and a large team from the Cabinet Office on the other. This happened, I think, from the best of motives. Ministers were showing their usual reluctance to take their places, and so the Cabinet Secretariat dutifully took theirs, without realising just how large the gathering was going to be.

There are advantages in the Private Office/Policy Unit sitting next to the Prime Minister, but we should not do this if the result is to force Ministers to sit in the one and ninepennies. The problem will only arise with the largest meetings, but where there is a potential problem, we should hold back until Ministers have claimed their seats. Cabinet Office will be adopting the same practice.

Cabinet Precedence and Seating Plan

The Ministerial appointments require some adjustments to the order of Ministerial precedence and a new Cabinet seating plan. I indicate my suggestions for both on the attachments.

- 2. As regards the precedence, Mr Lawson obviously drops out and the most natural course would be to leave other members of the Cabinet in the same order of seniority, apart from inserting Mr Waddington. The normal pattern is that the holders of the "big 3" departmental jobs rank before other Ministers however long they have been in the Cabinet. With this in mind, I have suggested inserting Mr Waddington after Mr Major.
- 3. The seating plan follows from this. Lord Mackay, Mr Hurd, Mr Major and Mr Waddington should occupy the four places most directly facing the Prime Minister. This is reflected in the attached plan. If the Prime Minister is content with it, I will have a clean copy made before next Thursday's Cabinet, and perhaps you would arrange for your office to put out place names.







The extra place is created by Lord Young (and those to his right) moving half a place to the right, and Mr Hurd (and those to his left) moving half a place in the opposite direction. This means that the Foreign Secretary and Chancellor of the Exchequer now sit one slightly to each side of and opposite the Prime Minister, rather than the Foreign Secretary being directly opposite and the Chancellor to his right. Those immediately to the Prime Minister's left on her side of the table move towards her into the space left by Mr King, allowing space for Mr Newton in the "junior" position, furthest from the Prime Minister on her left.

As regards the Cabinet seating plan, she thinks that now that Mr. Pym is senior to Sir Keith Joseph in the precedence list, he ought to sit on the Lord Chancellor's left and Sir Keith Joseph on the Chancellor of the Exchequer's right.

The Prime Minister is content with what you propose in paragraph 2 of your minute for the precedence of Ministers of State and Junior Ministers.

She wants Mr. Rees to take precedence over Dr. Vaughan in the Department of Trade.

In the Foreign and Commonwealth Office, Mr. Hurd should remain the senior Minister of State, and after him the order should be Mr. Marten, Lord Belstead and Mr. Onslow.

Thank you for sending me a copy of the new precedence list for Cabinet. In the light of this, I have revised the Cabinet seating plan. I attach this revision for the Prime Minister's approval. I have kept changes to a minimum.

- As for the precedence of Ministers of State and junior Ministers, I will, if the Prime Minister agrees, adopt the same practice as hitherto. That is to say, the Ministers of State are listed by Department in the same order as the Departmental precedence in Cabinet. Where there is more than one Minister of State in a Department, the precedence will be on the basis of seniority in the Department. Junior Ministers are listed by Department in alphabetical order but again within Departments the precedence is on the basis of seniority.
- There are two points about seniority on which I shall be grateful for the Prime Minister's views. First, since there is no longer a Cabinet Minister responsible for trade in the House of Commons, it will be important to establish which of the two Ministers of State (Dr. Vaughan and Mr. Rees) takes precedence in the Department of Trade. Mr. Rees has of course been in the Department of Trade several months longer than Dr. Vaughan. Secondly, the Ministerial changes have brought two new Ministers of State to the Foreign and Commonwealth Office. I take it that Mr. Hurd will remain the senior Minister of State, but I should be grateful to know whether Lord Belstead should precede Mr. Onslow and whether they in turn should precede, as hitherto, the Minister of State responsible for overseas development, Mr. Marten.




