Southend East By-Election

- 1. (a) The Liberal Candidate, David Evans, has been very active, distributing at least one newsletter a week in the constituency. Liberal MPs have already been to Southend, and David Steel is addressing a public meeting on 11th February.
 - (b) The Labour Party have not chosen their candidate yet.
 - (c) The Conservative Candidate will be in the field by the third week in February. About 20 would-be Candidates are being interviewed this weekend.
 - (d) The local newspaper has come out against your approach to the Olympics and for that reason pre-campaign publicity based on the FCS Poster which you liked has been held up.
 - (e) A range of questions have been posed by early Liberal activity. Here are two:-

In the event of the resignation or death of an MP, should the Party arrange for leaflet distribution and other robust forms of publicity before a new Candidate is selected?

Should there be a by-election team formed by Central Office who would cover every campaign rather the reliance upon individual Area Offices in every case?

- 2. The Liberals continue to make ground in Local Government by-elections. Do we put up the right candidates?

 Are the candidates receiving proper advice?

 Does Sir Frank Marshall have any ideas on this subject?
- 3. There are three GLC by-elections pending. Two in Croydon, one in Vauxhall.
- 4. Veiled criticism of Angus Maude continues. The critics deem his weekley liaison meetings inadequate and lingering reservations exist over the gas affair.
