BONN SUMMIT: (HEADS OF GOVERNMENT DINNER AT SCHLOSS GYMNICH ON 16 JULY at 2000.

C.C. Master Set

The Prime Minister has given the following summary of the points which arose in discussion during Chancellor Schmidt's dinner for Heads of Delegation at Schloss Gymnich on 16 July.

Cyprus

It was agreed that a five power approach, on the lines of the negotiations over Namibia, should be tried as a means of solving the Cyprus problem. President Carter had expressed optimism that Mr. Ecevit would make reasonable concessions to make a settlement possible.

Rhodesia

President Carter had urged all present to consider how they would react to a blood bath in Rhodesia if the search for a settlement failed.

Angola

It was agreed that Government's should develop their relations with President Neto. <u>President Giscard</u> commented that Neto could not survive without the Soviet Union.

South Africa

President Giscard had expressed great pessimism about the future of South Africa, which he compared with Algeria before independence. He expressed the view that the South Africa whites would inevitably be obliged to leave the country, like the French settlers in Algeria. The Prime Minister had informed his colleagues about the UK Government's consultations with British firms concerning future investment in South Africa.
