Defence Secretariat, should produce for their further consideration on 27 May 1982 a revised paper taking account of developments in the intervening period. Referring to their earlier agreement (4) to set in hand contingency studies for a variety of possible operational situations, he said they would also wish the Assistant Chief of the Defence Staff (Policy) to present for their consideration on Tuesday 25 May 1982 a paper setting out the contingencies which had been identified and the work which was in hand on them. In preparing the contingency studies paper, the Assistant Chief of the Defence Staff (Policy) should consult the Service Departments, the Defence Secretariat and the Foreign and Commonwealth Office, taking particular account of any politico/financial contingencies which might be identified.

ITEM 6. LIEUTENANT-COMMANDER ASTIZ

8. BRIGADIER GOODSON said that, if it were decided to send Lieutenant-Commander Astiz to the United Kingdom by sea (5), the earliest available ship would be the BRITISH ESK which was due at Ascension Island on 25 May, and which would arrive in the United Kingdom about 5 June. The Assistant Chief of the Defence Staff (Personnel and Logistics) was examining the problems of guarding Lieutenant-Commander Astiz should the latter be transferred to that ship.
