SUBJECT:

Thatcher Visit: Composition of meetings

State's memo at Tab A conveys Mrs. Thatcher's desiderata for her substantive meetings with the President so far as the participants are concerned. These constitute something of a departure from traditional practice since she is requesting, in effect, three meetings: 1) a one-on-one with the President, followed by 2) a "restricted" meeting (two on two), followed by 3) the expanded meeting with larger numbers of senior officials on both sides. The formula Mrs. Thatcher recommends - and I gather from State that she feels strongly about it - could be a bit cumbersome but do-able.

The NSC staff has reviewed the lists of participants and would amend them slightly (mainly to ensure that the triumvirate is included - also an NSC notetaker - at least for the expanded meeting), so that the line-up would look like this:

Visit of UK Prime Minister Thatcher - Meeting Subject: with the President

The British Embassy advised us February 19 that Prime Minister Thatcher has now suggested that she meet alone with the President at the start of their meeting at 10:30 a.m. on Thursday, February 26.

The Prime Minister also states that her preference would be for this private meeting to be followed by a meeting in which she and the President would be joined by their respective Secretaries of State.

Mrs. Thatcher would then wish to have a general meeting, as recommended in our memorandum of February 19 (copy attached) .
