The Prime Minister is preparing for the Tokyo Summit. This afternoon at 1500, accompanied by Sir Geoffrey Howe and Jim Prior, she will meet at TUC Economic Committee. (Mr. Prior will meet Lobby and Industrial Correspondents in 12 Downing Street at 1630 for an on-the-record press conference).

At 1630 Mrs. Thatcher will receive a courtesy call from Mr. Kim Jong-pil, Special Adviser to the President of South Korea.

This evening Mrs. Thatcher hoped to have an audience of The Queen.
