WRONG OR DER

1 Monday 23 Call from TL M + GH (with Wass) met on Budget. M pursued MY line that he needed an increase in taxes and would agree to a 1 penny rise in standard rate. (I had said a 2 or best a 3 penny rise was right but at least it is something). Have I had a delayed impact? I do not really believe it - nor did Tim. He said PN told GH that he must get the PSBR down or "you are for the chop" - very unlike her. Still waits see. Told Paddie about it and she was also sceptical.

10 Tuesday 24 GH is thinking about it - but all very secret

17 Wednesday 25 M + GH (with Douglas Wass?) met as M was packing. GH said he had thought about budget and need to reduce PSBR towards what M wanted (i.e. about £10 Bn) and best way was No Rooker wise. M apparently wants NOONE to know (i.e. not DW, JH or me).

But DW discovered the results of meeting - that DW and I think it is stupid politically, indefensible morally, and economically - but at least the PSBR will be about right and we shall avoid funding, staying crises etc

Thursday 26

Tony Benn warned me to agree to - 2 MLR charge. I reiterated that the no Rooker wise was bad both economically & morally. It was indefensible.

MT very annoyed at DW note saying that under this sort of budget in a few the directors would be fired - didn't finish it, save it up.

Britten reported to give big hint in Press that Friday 27

MLR was to be cut by 3% (In rest of Press reports of 4% as rumour), Middleton, witty budget speech, very surprised - argued whether should be 1% or 2%. Middleton finding it v. difficult with no Rooker wise a PSBR estimate rising by the hour, the Governor requiring no money targets but great emphasis on exchange rate - apparently GH did not stand up to Governor at all well. I told Middleton that I thought still that this budget had all the seeds of disaster, but a lot had been done on the macro level.

Saturday 28 But no RW and Bank tax were not defeated. The objection to a std rate increase is wholly political

Sir John + Lady Tydney - discussed M - she was still electorally
