Dear Margaret,

Perhaps it would be helpful if I were to put on paper four of the points that arose from our talk on Sunday:

- (a) John Murray of Bondworths might be helpful. I have already suggested to him that you might like to visit a factory.
- (b) You agreed that it might be sensible to make regular contact with the Tory leaders of local authorities, of whom Irwin Bellow is, I understand, to some extent the spokesman. Charles Morrison, I believe, knows all about it.
- (c) You agreed that we should seek an evening for a discussion on inflation led by Alan Walters and someone who would take a different view. I am discussing with Geoffrey and would be grateful if your office would offer us two or three dates a few weeks hence - one of which we can select after discussion between ourselves and with Alan.
- (d) Irwin Bellow is keen to invite you to Leeds in the run-up to the local elections - and will be writing to you.
