WASHINGTON AMBASSADOR

We did not foresee any early announcement. On the subject of Mr. Heath, Lobby were reminded of the Prime Minister's remarks at the formation of her Government, when she told the Lobby that she would want to make the best use for Britain of Mr. Heath's services. It followed from this that if a particular post came up for which he might be suited Mrs. Thatcher would, as a matter of course, consider him.

INDUSTRY DEBATE

We could not help with any announcements or decisions that might become public this afternoon.


Lobby were told of three "running" PNQs:
