It is the combination of a desire for immediate results
with the acceptance of a degree of force ~~and~~ which is
no potent. Inflation reinforces the desire for the
immediate and has a powerful effect in discounting
the value of the long-term view.

Instant comment has the effect of minimizing
the importance given to reflection and patience

One result of the desire for immediate results
is a refusal to face problems which do not appear to

be capable of immediate solution.

At the same time we have seen the rise of highly authoritarian regimes in which the freedom of the individual counts for little or nothing.

There is tension between the rights of freedom and the responsibility of any form for an ordered society:

Rule of Law, or ruled power,

rule of power doesn't.

Previously no rule of law for individuals
then development of it converted the individual

to being his own master.

Only a rule of law which can preserve our freedoms.

Responsibility to reputation is part of your responsibility to God.
