1. I am sorry to say that there has been a noticeable deterioration in the morale of our backbenchers.

- 2. I attribute this to:-
 - (a) Increasing concern about the extend of the recession and unemployment.
 - (b) The perceived defeats for the Government on Coal and, to a lesser extend, in the pay settlement for the water workers.
 - (c) The size of the P.S.B.R. and the slowness with which interest rates are falling.
 - (d) The insatiable appetite of the Public Sector notably B.L., B.S.C., N.C.B.
 - (e) The Rate Support Grant.
- 3. Derek Ezra addressed a crowded meeting of our Employment Committee on Wednesday. It was clear that the cost of Ezra's mishandling of the pit closure issue is going to be very substantial.
- 4. Alan Clark sent me a letter (undated) from Brian Troughton, which I attach; and Peter Rees sent another which I also attach. These are two only of many similar letters which have been sent to me by our Members this week.
- 5. The local elections will be bad for our Party.
- 6. I would like to discuss with you (and with Francis and Michael) how we can restore the morale of our Party within and without Parliament.
- 7. As you know, Edward du Cann is coming to see you at 6.15 p.m. on Monday.
- 8. I am sending a copy of this Note and of the two letters to Michael.
