Activities

Talked to Moose for his preliminary views on review of S.A. policy per your memo to the Secretary. He won't start to act until later in the week. (C)

Talked to David Newsome on State's lengthy deliberations on how to answer Mobutu's letter to the President suggesting a meeting, now possible in early September. No recommendation as yet. (C)

Talked to Kaplan, State/S/P, working on NAM, to encourage support of Sekou Toure's initiative (with Tito) for "directoriate" to reduce Cuban influence. (C)

Lunched with Squires, U.K. Embassy. He wanted reassurance that we didn't feel "left out" by Mrs. Thatcher's initiatives on Z-R. I assured him we were truly content to see the U.K. exercising its responsibility, and wished it well. We appreciated being kept informed, and would cooperate in every way possible, if and when asked. (C)

Zimbabwe: Embassy Pretoria reports that Muzorewa's UANC party parliamentary caucus has approved the Bishop's decision to include Ian Smith in the Salisbury delegation to the September 10 conference in London. The justification for the decision given in local news accounts argues that Smith's approval is essential for any settlement. (C)

ZAPU-ZANU have formally accepted the invitation to London. (U)
