Kenya -- Problems for the Moi Regime: An Embassy Nairobi analysis concludes that five months after his election, Kenyan President Moi is experiencing serious political difficulties. Problems plaguing the government include severe food and energy shortages; bureaucratic corruption; and, widespread confusion over the general policies of the government. (C)

defense ministers meeting would enhance proceedings. (S)

Despite these difficulties, the embassy feels that there is little threat to the regime. There is no organized parliamentary or military opposition. The people appear sympathetic to Moi, and Kenya's pro-Western, capitalist orientation is backed by a broad popular consensus. Excellent U.S.-Kenyan relations will probably not be affected by the current problems. (C)
