## THE MONETARY SCENE

The Chancellor will be seeing the Prime Minister at 9.00 a.m. on Thursday for his usual private chat.

- 2. The Prime Minister has said that she would like to discuss with him the current monetary scene, and has asked for a note which could form the basis of discussion. The Prime Minister is particularly concerned at the continuing high level of banking lending to the private sector.
- 3. The Prime Minister is also concerned that the free and spreading use of credit cards makes the task of controlling bank lending even more difficult. I said I would prefer not to cover this point in the note to No.10, since this might imply that the Treasury thought this was a problem; we would however make sure that the Chancellor was briefed to deal with any enquiries from the Prime Minister about it.
- 4. I should therefore be grateful if you could let us have a draft note for the Chancellor to send to the Prime Minister by close of play tomorrow, Tuesday, 11th September, and any supplementary briefing specifically covering the



credit card point - by close of play on Wednesday.

5. Tim Lankester also said that the Prime Minister was considering the possibility of arranging a lunch with the Chancellor and prominent bankers to discuss the present monetary situation. She may well raise this possibility with the Chancellor.
