## OTHER BUSINESS

Bos Ferranti had asked what to say when asked which other MPs were involved with the Centre, and whether there were any formal links, eg membership of the Advisory Council. KJ did NV? not want other MPs on the Advisory Council and it was agreed that Bos should be told that 'we have followers but don't publicise this because at this stage we wish to avoid polarisation'.

BW agreed to consider the technical implications of AS's suggestion that two charitable foundations should be set up. This was partly to forestall future legislation forbidding political contributions but also because a high proportion of

potential subscribers were expressing concern in the present industrial climate at making payments which have to be disclosed as political donations. There was also the point that political donations are non-deductible for tax purposes.
