

# DRAFT OPERATIONAL DIRECTIVE TO CINCFLEET - OP CORPORATE

- 1. The overall aim of OP CORPORATE is given at Ref A. The following directive sets out the broad operational tasks in order of precedence.
  - A. Establish and maintain the Exclusion Zone around the Falkland Islands.
  - B. Establish sea and air superiority round the Falkland Islands to complete the effectiveness of the Exclusion Zone as soon as possible.
  - C. Repossess South Georgia (OP PARAQUET) with or without detriment to the overall aim.
  - D. Repossess the Falkland Islands (OP SUTTON).

# DIRECTIVE TO CINCFLEET

# PLANNING DIRECTIVE - OP PARAQUET

1. You are to produce an outline plan covering a specific operation in the South Atlantic detailed below as part of Operation CORPORATE.

#### AIM

2. Overall aim of HMG in the current situation is to bring about the withdrawal of Argentine forces from the Falkland Islands and Dependencies and the re-establishment of British administration there as quickly as possible. Military deployment and operations are directed to the support of this aim.

#### MILITARY AIM OF OP PARAQUET

3. To repossess South Georgia as soon as possible.

#### LIMITATIONS

- 4. a. Civilian casualties must be kept to a minimum.
  - b. Safeguarding property is a lesser but important consideration.
  - c. The plan should cause the least detriment to other operations in the South Atlantic including possible landings on the Falkland Islands. Any implications to be reported.

#### ASSUMPTION

5. Intelligence other than in 6b below will be provided to the Task Force by CINCFLEET.

#### OPERATIONAL ASPECTS TO BE COVERED

- a. The establishment of sea and air control in the vicinity of South Georgia.
  - b. The aquisition of tactical intelligence by the Task Force.
  - c. Operations preceding and including the assault on the selected principal objectives on the assumption 6a and 6b above have been satisfactorily achieved.

  - 7. Recommend what forces will be necessary to maintain the security of South Georgia.
  - 8. The outline plan covering the above operation should be submitted to the Chiefs of Staff by Tuesday 13 April 1982.



# MILITARY APPRECIATION - LANDING OPERATIONS

### Directive to ACDS(Pol)

### AIM

- 1. You are to develop an appreciation of the options for Landing Operations in the Falkland Islands in support of HMG's express policy aim to bring about the withdrawal of Argentine forces from the Falkland Islands and re-establish British administration.
- 2. The specific aim of the appreciation for Operation SUTTON is "to assess the various military options for putting a force ashore in the Falkland Islands, with a view to repossessing the islands."

#### ASSUMPTIONS

3. a. South Georgia has been taken.

b. An effective sea/air Exclusion Zone has been established around the islands.

c. Operations are to be conducted so as to minimise loss of civilian life, and to avoid the complete window and to destruction of Port Stanley.

#### INPUTS

4. You are to obtain inputs on the factors affecting the above aim from:

a. Defence Intelligence Staff - to include, inter alia, material on Argentine build up in the Falklands in particular radar area coverage, helicopter gunships and heavy weapons, sestimated Argentine naval/air capability to interdict the landing, and UK tactical intelligence capability.

b. Navy Department/ - to include assessment of local sea/air superiority and potential landing locations, special operations and pre-landing support opertions.

c. CGRM in consultation with Army Department - to include assessment of initial objectives, landing phase, and subsequent operations. To take into account minimum loss of civilian life.

#### TIMESCALE

5. Inputs are to be supplied to ACDS(Pol)'s duty office (Room 7126) by 1200 Sunday 11 April. The first draft of the appreciation is to be available to the Chiefs of Staff (at 0930 Tuesday 13 April 1982).
