

NIMROD AIR-TO-AIR REFUELLING CAPABILITY

BACKGROUND

1. Studies have been carried out into the feasibility of Air-to-Air Refuelling (AAR) for Nimrod aircraft. The first aircraft with a trial installation will be ready for testing on 28 April.

PROPOSAL

2. It is proposed that a press release be made now, stating that the Nimrod MP aircraft currently deployed to Ascension Island will soon have the capability to carry out AAR.

DISCUSSION

- 3. The introduction of AAR gives the Nimrod virtually unlimited range of operations. In practice this would be limited by availability of sufficient Tanker Support.
- 4. Information already released gives Nimrod the capability of locating and then attacking submarines with Stingray (SPG Paper No 2). Further information that Nimrod would be able to operate for lengthy periods over Argentine waters would have a decidedly unsettling effect on the Argentine Navy.

RECOMMENDATION

5. It is recommended that the disclosure be made to the Press that, in the very near future, Nimrod Mk 2 aircraft will have an AAR capability.
