Worked on the President's response to Mrs. Thatcher on Zimbabwe. (C)

Worked with State and domestic political people on Zimbabwe Independence Delegation. (\mathtt{U})

Talked to Bill Ullman (Templesman Associates) on what is essentially the unofficial UN (Ahtisaari and Urquhart) view of their recent Namibian talks. SAG is still a little shell—shocked by Mugabe's victory, and somewhat divided and uncertain as to which way to proceed on Namibia. But the signs are becoming a little more positive. Separate memo. (S)

Talked with several of the actors involved in the private visit of Senghor, April 5-8. Mrs. Mondale cannot participate in ceremonies on Easter Sunday, although she had graciously agreed to do the job on Monday. Those in charge of the ceremonies won't budge. Louis Martin's office tells me that Fhil Wise/Fran Voorde have his request for a brief handshake in the Oval Office still under consideration. (C)

USSR/Front Line. Soviet efforts to invite themselves to Salisbury for a meeting with Mugabe have been unsuccessful so far. The mission to the Front Line States led by Deputy Foreign Minister Iliychev received a flat "no" from Mozambique and Nigeria when it requested their assistance in securing an appointment with Mugabe.
