4. Management Structure.

A potential condidate had appeared who KJ would be seeing. It was agreed not to advertise at this stage and to concentrate for the timebeing on discreet enquiries.

5. Themes.

The following were also raised:viii) Inflation and private enterprise.

ix) Savings. Well

From the above, Indexing of Savings and Analysis of Unemployment were extracted as individual subjects suitable for discussion meetings (with opposite views represented) at which to arrive at specific questions.

KJ was to approach Terence Higgins and Peter Jay about Indexing and might also approach Steadman(Unilever) and Arthur Knight (Courtaulds) about the Sextet and Interface respectively.
