European Council Meeting in Brussels 12 - 13 July, 1976

I attach the folder of briefs for the European Council on Monday and Tuesday, amended and up-dated since your briefing meeting, together with certain additional papers which you should see.

Direct Elections

The folder now contains the addendum which you saw at the briefing meeting, summarising the various proposals for the allocation of seats, which is now officially before the European Council. There is also a second addendum suggesting talking points in response to objections which the Danes are certain to voice at the meeting.

Following the abandonment of yesterday's business in the House of Commons, arrangements have been made to debate Direct Elections very late on Monday night. A note by Ken Stowe is at Flag A.


The President of the European Movement has sent you a message (text in French at Flag B) pressing for agreement on Direct Elections at next week's meeting.



You will also remember that you said you would like to talk to Mr. Jenkins before going to Brussels, and he will be available in the Home Office on Monday morning (unless you wanted to telephone him before then).
