Since our brief word yesterday, I have studied what you said on 29th July about our future policy towards participation in the cil inductry. I gather, incidentally, that one or two people may think that even your cattiously stated position is likely to cause uncertainty and delay.

In light of what Margaret said during the Recess, and of our discussion yesterday, I believe there is a need for us to reconsider the position, if we can create an opportunity for doing that, in order to ensure that we are all singles the same tune and that our tune is, somehow or other, consistent with both mational and political needs.

I have had a word with Keith about this and he is prepared, to agree that we should try to find an opportunity of considering the carbon. It might be possible, in the first instance, for us to have shother look at it in the context of the work of our Bosonic Reconstruction Policy Group.

With this possibility in mind, I wender if you can find the time to prepare a short background paper, which would include the texts of the several statements that have been made about this. We can then work out where we go from there.

I have not yet mentioned this to Margaret, but shall try to find a quist opportunity of doing so. Meantime, this letter come on a perconal and confidential besis, copied only to Keith Joseph and Adra Riddey.
