This is 2,700 less than at 1 January and 27,200 below the 1 April The major reductions in the last quarter have been in: 2,200 PSA (incl. Supplies Division) 800 700 Employment Group Inland Revenue Customs and Excise The most significant increases were in: + 800 Mainly recruitment of fraud investigation staff + 400 Mainly prison staff Home Office Royal Ordnance + 200 Industrial staff to meet Factories production requirements Most departments have continued or reimposed restrictions on recruitment in anticipation of the additional reductions in manpower costs to be achieved in 1980-81. The reduction of 27,000 is the largest in real terms (ie excluding the effect of machinery of government changes) made in any year since the late 1950s. I propose to quote the figure tomorrow, Wednesday, in reply to Oral Questions and I am having an appropriate press release prepared. I am copying this to Angus Maude.
