- We also raised the subject at the Geneva negotiations in December 1978. Sr Oliveri Lopez told Mr Hall that the Argentines had silenced the station for the moment until they had completed their enquiries.
- 5. Broadcasting resumed in February 1979 but ceased after our Embassy spoke informally to the Malvinas Department. (The Foreign Ministry is in the hands of the Air Force. The base at Thule is operated by the Navy. Last February the Foreign Ministry appeared to have the upper hand.)

To lodge a further formal protest could risk raising the temperature in our relations with Argentina in a period which might precede further discussions. To take no action could further erode our claim over the South Sandwich Islands, and possibly attract criticism in Parliament and from the Islanders themselves (who are intensely irritated by the broadcasts in question). The most appropriate course, which Mr Carless also favours, would be for him to speak informally to Sr Oliveri Lopez on the lines of FCO
