CIVIL SERVICE DISPUTE

The Prime Minister has read the Lord President's minute of 1 May. She has noted his view that "we are unlikely to get the unions to settle without arbitration for 1982". She has, however, confirmed that when she said arbitration was nonnegotiable she had in mind 1982 as well as 1981. She remains of the view that arbitration in 1982 would cause the greatest difficulties for the Government.
