VISIT TO MONTGOMERY, BRECON AND RADNOR: FRIDAY 2 JULY

You are due to visit these constituencies in Wales on 2 July, before going on to Gloucestershire on 3 July.

I attach a programme, which has been agreed between Mr. Edwards and the Conservative Area Agent for Wales. Mr. Edwards had suggested that you go on a "walkabout" in Welshpool, but Derek and I both feel that it would be more secure and more worth while for you to make a specific visit in Welshpool, and we suggest that you go to a primary school there.

I should add that Mr. Edwards has pointed out that you will be visiting mid-Wales just at the time when, as far as can be seen now, important decisions affecting the future of industrial development in mid-Wales will have been taken in the context of the Assisted Area Status Review. Any unfavourable decisions that may emerge from the Review will obviously not be welcome in mid-Wales. But I think this is a risk that we must take.
