Dear Mrs. Thatcher,

Please find enclosed a copy of a letter signed by 78 athletes concerning participation in the Olympic Games, which you are asked to take firm note of.

At a Committee Meeting of the I.A.C. yesterday it was furthermore resolved that this organisation apply formally and immediately to the I.O.C. for permission to select, transport and manage a British Athletics team for Moscow in the event the B.A.A.B. or B.O.A. act in breach of Rule 24c., viz:

"N.O.C.s must be autonomous and must resist all pressures of any kind whatsoever, whether of a political, religious or economic nature. In pursuing these objectives, N.O.C.s may co-operate with private or government organisations. However, they must not associate themselves with any undertaking which would be in conflict with the principles of the Olympic movement and with the rules of the I.O.C."

We, the undersigned, affirm our right to take part in the Olympic Games in Moscow.

We make it clear that in no way do we support Soviet domestic and foreign policies. Just as the presence of the British Ambassador in Moscow implies no approval of the regime, neither will our presence in Moscow in July imply approval.

Since, however, we have an opportunity of expressing our disapproval of Societ policies, we are prepared, under explicit instruction of the B.A.A.B., to refuse to take part in the Opening and Closing Ceremonies and, in the event that we are recipients of medals, to leave the rostrum immediately after presentation and before the National Anthems are played.

We are not prepared, however, to preside over the destruction of the Olympic movement, and consider that in the end, the Government's responsibility to solve the Afghan crisis is through normal diplomatic means.

We would now like the right and opportunity of preparing ourselves for the Olympic Games free of governmental pressure.

We hope that participants in other Olympic Sports will join us in this action.
