At least some members of the TUC will come to your meeting
prefixed to be unsatisfactory at Leipzig but afterwards they can
say that this was your attitude and not their own. I think there
would be a bad thing for government at this time. So you're
bothering me with a suggestion that I believe might help.
Get the result of moreenary meetings with union leaders
than most people!

First they will be inadequately briefed on the facts.
So why not offer them a formal Treasury briefing on
the economic tasks. Not from Ministers but from officials
alone. If protocol is a problem NEDC could arrange.

Second they will expect to be rebuffed. So why not suggest
that the government would back, with its own money,
any programme of information agreed by CBI & TUC
dealing with what can be done now to mitigate
unemployment by re-training, job experience etc. &
what must be done to maintain our industrial base
for the upturn by better productivity & efficiency.

Things are rough enough for people to expect
a constructive lead from the government. Not in the
sense of a change of policy but in the sense of spelling
out what ends the policies are aimed at.

We all need to see a bit of a glimmer somewhere
down the end of the tunnel, perhaps even the NCC
will at the even to that.

In all this I believe that you should
take the line that our partners should unite us
and not divide the nation.
