Activities

At UNGA yesterday had substantive discussions with F.M. of Zambia (worried and angry about Mozambique raids) and F.M. of Zaire (pleased with outcome of Mobutu's visit and receptive to idea that reforms must continue, and be seen to continue). (S)

Worked with Moose to get message to Carrington on our concern at Mozambique raids, and asking him to join us in our approaches (sent separately) to Salisbury, Maputo and Lusaka, - asking for restraint. (S)

Worked with State/AF/W to get agreed memcons on the Tolbert visit. The language on Angola in your memo last night to Cy is consistent with what we are putting in the memcon. (C)

Met with Henry Richardson, who is in General Counsel's Office, DOD, and still maintaining an interest in Africa. (U)

Talked to Congressman Solarz, who is pleased with the President's stand on the defense authorization Byrd amendment, and with Congressman Diggs, who is expressing concern about putting more pressure on SAG, (- probably in reaction to Jesse Jackson's visit.) (C)

Press Contacts. Reed Kramer of Africa News, for a general background prior to his extended trip to several African states. Sol Sanders of Business Week, for background on Lancaster House, - and to probe on his "hot lead" that the President and Mrs. Thatcher were mutually antagonistic, and would probably "break" over the outcome of the Z-R talks. He will be interviewing both Mugabe and Savimbi soon, and he asked for guidance in questioning. (C)
