SUBJECT: Additional Information Items

Borge and Torrijos to Meet with Honduran Official: General Paz informed Ambassador Jaramillo on Friday that he has accepted a request to meet secretly on October 11 with GRN official Tomas Borge in Tegucigalpa. Paz assumes the Nicaraguans want to reassure themselves that Honduras will not permit its soil to be used to stage Guardia Nacional attacks against Nicaragua. Honduras, in turn, would like assurances that Managua will not export the revolution. (S)

Paz also stated that Torrijos has asked to meet with him on October 15 which Paz suspects is to confirm that Honduras is "telling the same story to Nicaragua and Panama." (S)

Rhodesian London Conference: Kaunda's aide Mark Chona told Embassy London that the British were underestimating the strength of Patriotic Front feeling on the issue of denying automatic citizenship to post-1965 Rhodesian immigrants. But an FCO official has told the embassy that the UK will hold firm on this issue. Chona also said that he had told Mrs. **Thatcher** that an international force was necessary to implement an agreement. He did not reveal her reaction, but said he came away reassured. (S)
