Dear Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher, I have received a letter from Federal Chancellor Helmut Schmidt in which he presents an account of the latest initiatives in the Federal Republic's economic policy. In Denmark, too, the Government has given serious attention to the question of increased economic activity in Europe with the aim of combating unemployment. We are keenly aware that all the EC Governments are giving high priority to this question and I have therefore answered Mr. Helmut Schmidt's ./. letter by the letter of which a copy is enclosed. As will be seen from my letter, it would be of great interest to the Danish Government if the next meeting of the European Council could be devoted entirely to this topic. In my view it would be extremely important if we could agree on some assessments that could lead to increased economic activity.
