UM-ARGENTIME RELATIONS

- 1. YOU SHOULD KNOW THAT FOLLOWING MY TELELETTER TO YOU OF 29

 "A", WE PRODUCED A PAPER FOR THE SECRETARY OF STATE WHICH WAS

 ACREED BY MR RIDLEY IN WHICH WE RECOMMENDED PUTTING A MINUTE TO
 THE PRIME MINISTER AND THE RELEVANT CABINET COMMITTEE ASKING FOR

 ENERAL AGREEMENT TO THE OUTLINES OF FALKLAND ISLANDS POLICY IN

 ORDER TO GIVE MR RIDLEY A GENERAL CONTEXT IN WHICH TO OPERATE

 CURING HIS VISITS TO THE FALKLAND ISLANDS AND BUEMOS AIRES. THE

 PROPOSAL WAS THAT WE SHOULD AGREE TO CONTINUE NEGOTIATIONS ON THE

 PREVIOUS BASIS, INCLUDING NEGOTIATIONS ON SOVEREIGNTY, AND THAT,

 AS PART OF AN OVERALL SOLUTION, WE SHOULD BE PREPARED TO CONSIDER

 FRESH ARPANGEMENTS ON SOVEREIGNTY IN FAVOUR OF ARGENTINA WHICH

 WOULD NOT AFFECT THE EXERCISE OF SOVEREIGN RIGHTS OVER THE

 FALKLAND ISLANDERS BY HMG, PROVIDED THAT SUCH ARRANGEMENTS HERE

 ACCEPTABLE TO THE FALKLAND ISLANDERS.
- P. THE SECRETARY OF STATE'S REACTION WAS THAT HE DID NOT 121T TO HAVE TO DEAL WITH THIS PROBLEM FOR THE FORESEEABLE FUTURE 1110 THAT ME SHOULD TRY TO KEEP IT QUIET FOR AS LONG AS POSSIBLE. I 48 GUED FOR THE LINE WHICH WE HAD PROPOSED, BUT COULD GET NO DECISION TO TAKE THIS FURTHER.
- MEYERTHELESS, AS YOU WILL HAVE SEEM FROM THE LETTER TO THASHINGTON PASTOR, THE SHALL CONTINUE THIS DIALOGUE IN A CONSTRUCTIVE SPIRIT, ETC'. I THINK YOU FILL FIND, HOWEVER, THAT WE WILL GO ON FROM WHERE MATTERS WERE LEFT IN MARCH, BUT THERE IS NO ENTHUSIASM FOR TAKING BOLD DECISIONS. IN THE TALK AND LUNCH WITH CAVANDOLI MR RIDLEY MADE IT CLEAR THAT WE WANTED TO CO-OPERATE WITH ARGENTINA CLOSELY IN ANTARCTIC MATTERS, 15 FISHERY AND OIL EXPLOITATION IN THE SOUTH ATLANTIC, OVER SUPPLIES FOR THEIR MUCLEAR POWER PROGRAMME, IN THEIR AIR FORCE AND 1 AVY AND IN TRADE AND ECONOMIC MATTERS GENERALLY. CAVAMBOLI REPLIED THAT THE ARGENTINE SIDE EQUALLY MANTED THIS BUT THAT PART OF THE FACKAGE WOULD MEED TO BE BRITISH WILLINGMESS TO CONTINUE MEGCTIATIONS OVER THE FALKLAND ISLANDS, INCLUDING SOVEREIGHTY, AND THAT THESE NEGOTIATIONS NEEDED REVIVING FROM THE LOS POINT THEY HAD REACHED AT THE END OF MARCH. EFEL BY CLES YEARIN PM PREPARED TO CONTINUE THESE NEGOTIATIONS BUT THAT THE GOVERNMENT WOULD MEED TIME TO LOOK CAREFULLY AT THIS PROBLEM BEFORE UMBERTAKING FORMAL NEGOTIATIONS, PRECOCUPIED AS THEY MERE MITH MANY OTHER IMMEDIATE PROBLEMS AND WITH HAVING TO BRIEF THEMSELVED AS MINISTERS COMING FRESH TO MANY OF THE QUESTIONS REACHING THEM FOR DECISION. CAVANDOLI SEEMED VERY HAPPY WITH THIS AND IN GENERAL WITH THE RECEPTION HE HAD RECEIVED. I TOLD HIM THAT THE SORT OF PROGRAMME HE HAD IM MIND WAS FURTHER GEMERAL EXPLORATORY DISCUSSION BETVEEN MR RIDLEY AND HIMSELF IN MID-JULY, COVERING

DISCUSSION BETVEEN MY RIDLEY AND HIMSELF IN TID-JULY, COVERING ANGLO-APOENTIME RELATIONS IN GENERAL, A FIRST CONTACT RETVEE! THE SECRETARY OF STATE AND MASHINGTON PASTOR IN NEW YORK IN THE ANTHUMN AND PERHAPS A FORMAL POUND OF MEGOTIATIONS BETTEEN MRUTUA RIDLEY AND HIMSELF REFORE THE END OF THE YEAR. MR CAVARDOLT TOLO WE THAT HE THOUGHT THIS PROGRAMME "DULD SUIT THE ADDENTIME SVERNMENT ADMIRABLY. CAVANDOLI ASKED MR RIDLEY PARTICULARLY TO TRY IF HE COULD TO AVOID MAKING ANY STATEMENT IN THE ISLANDS OR IN ARGENTINA BEFORE HE HAD TALKED TO THE ARGENTINE GOVERNMENT, UNDER THE PRESSURE THERE WOULD UNDOUBTEDLY BE FROM THE PRESS, HICH MIGHT BE TAKEN UP AND MISUSED BY CERTAIN ELEMENTS IN ARCENTINA TO ATTACK OUR IMPROVED RELATIONS OR THE NEGOTIATIONS OVER THE FALKLAND ISLANDS. MR RIDLEY SAID THAT WHILST, OF COURSE, HE MUST REMAIN FREE TO SAY WHAT HE THOUGHT BEST, HE UNDERSTOOD CAVANDOLI'S POINT, AGREED WITH IT, AND HOPED THE ARGENTINES TOUCH DO THE SAME.

- 4. AS YOU SEE WE ARE IN FOR A CONTINUATION OF THE 'BACK RUPYER' AND MR RIPLEY WOULD RATHER DISCUSS ALL ITEMS OF RELATIONS WITH ARGENTINA OTHER THAN SOVEREIGNTY OVER THE FALKLAND ISLANDS BUT WILL BE PREPARED TO DISCUSS THIS ALSO, WITHOUT GOING FURTHER THAN WE HAVE DONE BEFORE. EVEN TO GO AS FAR WILL PROBABLY REQUIRE US TO MAKE A FURTHER ATTEMPT WITH THE SECRETARY OF STATE BEFORE MR RIPLEY GOES TO BUENOS AIRES.
- ATTENDED BY SIR RONALD ELLIS, JAMES JOHNSON MP, DAVID MONTCOMERY AND HUNTER CHRISTIE. THERE WAS A GOOD DEAL OF CONVERSATION ABOUT FISHERIES IN THE SOUTH ATLANTIC AND MR RIDLEY AND RON ELLIS TALKED ABOUT ARGENTINE AIR FORCE REQUIREMENTS. ON FISHERIES I REPEATED STRONGLY WHAT I HAD SAID TO GUEVARA, THAT THE FIRST ESSENTIAL WAS TO CONTROL THE ACTIVITIES OF THIRD PARTIES FISHING IN THE AREA, PARTICULARLY TO CONSERVE AND RENEW FISH STOCKS AND THAT THE BRITISH WIDE WOULD BE PERFECTLY WILLING TO REGIN SUCH CO-OPERATION IMMEDIATELY, WHILST THE ARGENTINES WERE BLOCKING THIS BY DEMANDING CONCESSIONS ON SOVEREIGNTY FIRST. THIS TAS SUPPORTED BY ALL THOSE ON THE BRITISH SIDE, INCLUDING HUNTER CHRISTIE WHO IN GENERAL MADE NO SUALIFICATIONS ABOUT SUPPORT FOR ANGLO-ARGENTINE CO-OPERATION.
- 4. I HOPE THIS WILL BE USEFUL IN THE RUN UP TO MR RIDLEY'S VISIT. WE ARE PRODUCING TALKING POINTS FOR HIM ON ALL DESECTOR ANGLO-ARGENTINE RELATIONS AND GO OPERATION. THE EMPHADIS FROM HIS SIDE WILL BE TO PLAY DOWN POLITICS, AND PARTICULARLY SOVEREIGNTY, AND TO HIGHLIGHT TRADE AND ECONOMICS. YOU WILL UNDOUBTEDLY BE UNDER PRESSURE FROM THE ARGENTINES TO GO EXACTLY THE REVERSE.
