Activities

IAP/Shaba. Spent much time urging DOD to complete their soundings on the Hill, and to thrash out their differences with State, so that we can go forward with some sort of airlift, to try to demonstrate to the Moroccans and interested African states that we have a functioning government. At 4:50 p.m. DAS Slocombe called to say that DOD was on board. State/DAS Walker is sending appropriate cables tonight. Meanwhile, Moroccan transports (3-130's) were reported flying substantial numbers of Moroccan troops north through Kinshasa airport this morning. (C)

Our Man In Salisbury. Met with Jeff Davidow who returned from Salisbury after one month for consultations and to pick up his family. His observations tend to confirm the conventional wisdom, - Muzorewa is not taking hold, is concentrating on winning the hearts and minds of the Whites, and the rural areas become more chaotic while everyone waits for a solution, - from London or Lusaka, or perhaps heaven. (C)

AFL-CIO. Met with AFL-CIO International Affairs people who strongly suggest that they will be supporting a return to the ILO sometime in early 1980. (C)

Commonwealth/Nyerere. Nyerere has presented a "plan" for settlement in Z-R, calling for: (1) a new constitution; (2) new free and fair elections, - held after a ceasefire, and under international supervision; and (3) a Commonwealth resettlement fund. He says he is "encouraged" by Mrs. Thatcher's statements at Lusaka, and is "looking forward to more specific statements about the British Government's proposals and plans." (U)
