CHIEFS OF STAFF MEETING, 8 APRIL

- 1. I attended the second Chiefs of Staff meeting today at 4 p.m., at which there was some discussion of planning for amphibious operations against both South Georgia and the Falkland Islands.
- 2. The CDS said that Ministers had already indicated that they would like to go for an operation to re-possess South Georgia as soon as possible, and that planning should go ahead on the basis that this could be implemented by about 21 April. I received the clear impression that the Defence Staff have drawn a distinction between an operation against South Georgia (which they regard as certain) and operations against the Falkland Islands (which they regard as subject to parallel political or diplomatic activity).
- 3. There was also some discussion of possible psychological operations (Psyops), and a paper was circulated (but subsequently withdrawn) containing some fairly fanciful ideas. I said that we would wish to be closely consulted on any such operations, but that we would look to the Ministry of Defence for a clear indication of the military aim of any proposals they wished to put to us. I emphasised that any such planning needed to be handled by a very small circle.
