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#### CABINET

#### PUBLIC EXPENDITURE 1982-83 AND 1983-84

Memorandum by the Chief Secretary, Treasury

1. As requested at Cabinet last week, I have now discussed with the Ministers concerned those of the proposals in C(80) 72 Table 3 for 1982-83 and 1983-84 as were not already agreed.

2. / The Table attached set out policy reductions and increases in progress the figures in the March White Paper revalued, excluding nationalised industries.

 There are no outstanding issues. I need to draw attention to two points only.

i. I have agreed with the Minister of <u>Transport</u> that the reductions in his programme for the later years should be limited to the amounts equivalent to carrying forward the 1 per cent off local authority current spending and 2 per cent off other cash-controlled programmes agreed for 1981-82.

ii. The Secretary of State for Scotland was asked to consider whether he could find savings of £20 million in 1982-83 and £30 million in 1983-84, instead of the £10 million additional reduction already agreed for 1981-82, without these reductions becoming publicly evident, when the White Paper is published, as going beyond what would be justified under the standard formula, He has concluded that he sees no way of making these additional reductions in the published figures without this becoming evident. But he has told me that, if it were possible to go be yond the £10 million without compromising the political considerations which Cabinet found persuasive, he would be willing to do so. Accordingly in the next year's Survey he will review his programme figures for 1982-83 and 1983-84, to see whether some way could be found of doing this. I propose therefore that in the coming White Paper only this year's £10 million cut should be carried forward into the next two years and that we return to this question next year.

4. I invite the Cabinet to endorse the figures in Table 1/for spending plans in 1982-83 and 1983-84, for publication in the next public expenditure White Paper.
