Decision After Full Dress Debate at Town Council Meeting

## MOVE TO REVERT TO PRE-WAR PROCEDURE DEFEATED

A RESOLUTION, WHICH SOME OF THE MEMBERS ALLEGED WAS TANTAMOUNT TO A VOTE OF A "NO CONFIDENCE" IN THE WAR EMERGENCY COMMITTEE, PRODUCED A FULL-DRESS MERATE AT WEDNESDAY'S MEETING OF GRANTHAM TOWN COUNCIL, ONE OF THE LONGEST
