Sew Hark FUTURE OF ILEA I cannot trace a reply or even an acknowledgement of my letter of 27 March; and I was very surprised indeed to read in the press over the weekend that you are now to hold a departmental inquiry into this matter. It really would help a lot if we knew what the Government was up to. If we do need a rigmarole by all means let us have it - but let us know why we are having it. As it happens I cannot see the need for further deliberation as long as primary legislation alone is intended. That brings me on to the timing. As I understand it unless access to Parliamentary time is arranged before June the matter will not be processed within this GLC administration's lifetime; and I have it in mind that, in effect, means never. Can you please let me know what is going on. Meanwhile I am copying this letter to the Prime Minister and David Smith. Jusewer Hrace.
