Dear Prime Minister,

I would like to thank you most sincerely for finding the time to come and visit our Battalion in South Armagh. To lose one's commanding officer is always a blow; to lose one of the stature of Colonel David Blair is doubly hard as one rarely has the privilege to serve under a man of such charm and ability. In our close knit family Regiment the loss was felt deeply by all ranks.

Although I believe his death has in no way affected the efficiency of the Battalion the personal concern you showed for your soldiers by visiting Crossmaglen displayed the sort of leadership this country has so long been needing and it has done much to fortify this Battalion for the remainder of its tour in Northern Ireland.

I hope you were not offended by

The Lemming Certificate. It was just my Sergeant Major's way of saying thank you.

You might be interested to know that many of the villagers of Crossmaglen who normally refuse to talk to us except to express hostility to the British have been coming up to my soldiers expressing great respect and admiration for you and sadness that they could not have met you personally when you visited.

I hope that this change in attitude will lead to an increase in low level intelligence in our battle to defeat terrorism.
