Thank you for your thoughts on the political future.

The most worrying prospect is that of a National government with a Socialist majority. In that event, the Socialists would not give up Socialism; they would merely use the broader base of a National government to take us further down the road to irreversible Socialism.

I do not believe the nation

wants Nehru. Our efforts, therefore
should be directed towards fungi
Nehru we do not drift into it
through our own fanatic to
lead, or through the people's fanatic
to become politically involved.

If the time should come when
colleagues are asked to join a Nehru
government, I hope they will do it a
very tough bargain. Our people are
prepared to take sacrifices for Brahman
but not for Socialism.
