# LEE KUAN YEW TALKS


It was inevitable that the problem of refugees would be raised: the Prime Minister's view was what it always had been, namely that this was a problem best solved in an international context.

# MPS' AND MINISTERS' PAY

We did not see a statement coming today. Set against the Government making a statement as soon as possible (and, it was hoped, reaching a decision this morning), the Prime Minister would still want to consider whether she should be in the House for any statement. Her presence there was, of course, determined by travel commitments to (a) Strasbourg and (b) Tokyo. We could make no comment on any figures in this morning's papers, nor could we offer any guidance on phasing.
