The Prime Minister has asked me to say that an increase in the mortgage rate must be avoided - if necessary through a temporary subsidy. She has requested that contingency plans should be made with a view to preventing any rise in the rate - if necessary to be implemented forthwith. She would like to be assured that such planning is under way before she leaves for Tokyo. I am sending a copy of this letter to David Edmonds (Department of the Environment) and to Martin Vile (Cabinet Office).
